# *Introduction*

The Book of Isaiah is a powerful message of both warning and hope, calling for trust and obedience while painting a vivid picture of God's plan of salvation centered in the Messiah, applicable for the people of Isaiah's day and for believers in the last days.

In essence, Isaiah presents a duality: severe judgment for sin alongside magnificent hope for redemption, all centered on the character and unfailing plan of the holy God.



# ***Introduction***

**The Messianic Hope:** Isaiah is often called the "Messianic Prophet" because of his detailed prophecies about Jesus Christ. SDA theology emphasizes how Isaiah's references to the "Suffering Servant" (Isaiah 53) and the "Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6) predict Christ's first and second advents, highlighting His atoning sacrifice and His future reign.


**The Second Coming of Christ:** The anticipation of Christ's imminent return is a central motif. Adventist interpretations often link specific prophecies in Isaiah to events surrounding the Second Coming and the establishment of God's eternal kingdom on a new earth.



# *Introduction*

**Judgment and Restoration:** Isaiah delivers stern warnings of judgment against Judah and surrounding nations for their idolatry and social injustice, but this judgment is seen as a purifying process. A message of hope and restoration consistently accompanies these warnings, promising that a faithful "remnant" will be preserved and a new Jerusalem established.

**The Sanctuary and Cleansing:** This perspective uniquely connects Isaiah's descriptions of the temple and its rituals to the concept of the heavenly sanctuary and Christ's ministry within it, including the investigative judgment.




# *Introduction*

**The Great Controversy**: Isaiah's prophecies are viewed within the broader context of the cosmic conflict between Christ and Satan (the Great Controversy motif). The book is seen as depicting this ongoing struggle, culminating in God's final triumph and the ultimate vindication of His people.

**God's Holiness and Sovereignty**: The book repeatedly emphasizes God as the "Holy One of Israel" and highlights His absolute authority over nations and history. This calls for repentance, a life of holiness, and trust in His divine plan.

**A Universal Plan of Salvation**: Isaiah envisions God's salvation extending beyond Israel to include all nations, a theme that aligns with the Adventist global mission to share the gospel.



# **1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah**

## **1. The Virgin Birth & Divine Son**

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 7:14](#):

Prophesies the sign of a virgin conceiving and bearing a son, named Immanuel (God with us).

**Fulfilment:** [Matthew 1:22-23](#):

Explicitly connects Isaiah's prophecy to Jesus' birth, explaining that "Immanuel" means "God with us," signifying Jesus' divine nature and presence.



# ***1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah***

## ***2. Names & Titles of the Messiah***

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 9:6-7](#): Foretells the child who would be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace, establishing an eternal kingdom.

**Fulfilment:** [Luke 1:32-33](#): The angel Gabriel tells Mary that her son, Jesus, "will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever; and of his kingdom there will be no end".



# 1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah

## 3. Born in Bethlehem

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 9:1-2](#) mentions a ruler from the line of Jesse (David's father), fulfilled by Jesus's birth in Bethlehem.

**Fulfilment:** Yes, Jesus' birth in Bethlehem is clearly stated in the New Testament Gospels of Matthew and Luke, with [Matthew 2:1](#) saying, "Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem,"



# 1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah

## 4. Root of Jesse

Prophecy: [Isaiah 11:1-2](#) "A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse" - fulfilled by Jesus, descendant of David.

Fulfilment: [Matthew 1:1-17](#) (Genealogy of Jesus): This passage traces Jesus' lineage directly back through David to Jesse, establishing Him as the promised Messiah from the Davidic line, the "shoot" from the "stump".



# 1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah

## 5. *Spirit of the Lord*

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 11:2](#) describes the Spirit of wisdom, understanding, counsel, might, knowledge, and fear of the Lord resting on Him.

**Fulfilment:** [Matthew 3:16](#), [Mark 1:10](#), [Luke 3:22](#), and [John 1:32](#) The Holy Spirit descended on Jesus like a dove at His baptism, a key event described in all four Gospels, with a voice from heaven affirming Jesus as God's beloved Son, marking the beginning of His public ministry and commissioning.

[Luke 4:18-19](#) is a New Testament passage where Jesus reads from the scroll of Isaiah in the synagogue, declaring His mission.



# 1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah

## 6. Light to Gentiles

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 9:2](#) ("people walking in darkness have seen a great light") fulfilled by Jesus's ministry in Galilee.

**Fulfilment:** [Matthew 4:13-16](#) in the New Testament describes Jesus moving to Capernaum after leaving Nazareth, fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy about a great light dawning on people in darkness in the regions of Zebulun and Naphtali, signifying the arrival of God's Kingdom and spiritual illumination.



# 1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah

## 7. Preceded by a Messenger

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 40:3](#) ("A voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way of the Lord'") fulfilled by John the Baptist.

**Fulfilment:** [Luke 3:3-6](#) describes John the Baptist preaching in the Jordan region, calling for a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy about preparing the way for the Lord by making paths straight and smooth, so that all people could see God's salvation.




# 1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah

## 8. Despised and Rejected

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 53:3](#)

describes the Messiah as someone despised, rejected, a man of sorrows, familiar with pain, and ignored by people.

**Fulfilment:** [John 1:11](#) states that, "He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him," meaning Jesus came to His own people (the Jews) but was largely rejected by them.




# **1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah**

## **9. Wounded for our Transgressions**

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 53:5](#) describes the suffering servant (the Messiah, Jesus) who takes on humanity's sins, being "wounded for our transgressions, bruised for our iniquities," and by His suffering ("stripes," "wounds"), brings healing and peace to people.

**Fulfilment:** [1 Peter 2:24](#) tells us about Jesus's sacrificial death, stating He "bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; meaning His crucifixion paid the penalty for our sins.



# 1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah

## 10. Silent before accusers

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 53:7](#) This verse shows the "Suffering Servant" prophecy, which is foreshadowing Jesus Christ's willingness to endure unjust suffering and crucifixion for humanity's sins, without complaint.

**Fulfilment:** [Matthew 27:12](#) describes Jesus's silence when accused by the chief priests and elders before Pontius Pilate, emphasizing His quietness amidst severe charges, as He "answered nothing" or "gave no answer," showing remarkable restraint even as accusations mounted.



# 1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah

## 11. Pierced

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 52:14](#) describes the disfigured appearance of the Suffering Servant (Jesus Christ), highlighting the shocking, inhuman suffering that leads to the nations' amazement and eventual understanding of God's salvation.

**Fulfilment:** [John 19:34](#) This significant verse describes an unnamed Roman soldier piercing Jesus' side after His death, from which blood and water flowed.



# 1 - *Jesus in the book of Isaiah*

## 12. *Crucified with criminals*

**Prophecy:** [Isaiah 53:12](#) This verse prophesies that the Messiah (Jesus Christ) would suffer, be counted among lawbreakers, and intercede for humanity, a prophecy fulfilled when Jesus was crucified between two criminals.

**Fulfilment:** [Matthew 27:38](#) describes Jesus' crucifixion between two criminals, a fulfilment of prophecy and an act of shame that positioned Him among transgressors.




# 1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah

## 13. Buried with the rich

Prophecy: [Isaiah 53:9](#) This verse describes the suffering servant's (Jesus) unjust burial, linking him with the wicked in death but also with the rich, highlighting his innocence despite being condemned like a criminal, a prophecy about Jesus Christ's crucifixion and burial.

Fulfilment: [Matthew 27:57-60](#) describes Joseph of Arimathea, a rich disciple of Jesus, asking Pilate for Jesus' body, wrapping it in clean linen, and placing it in his own new tomb, sealing it with a great stone.



# 1 - Jesus in the book of Isaiah

## 14. Death Not the End

Prophecy: [Isaiah 53:10-12](#) describes God's plan for the suffering Servant (Jesus), stating that though the Lord willed Him to be bruised and made His soul an offering for sin, the Servant would see His offspring, prolong His days, and prosper.

Fulfilment: [Romans 6:9](#) emphasizes that just as Christ conquered death, believers are freed from sin's power, meaning sin can no longer rule over them.




## **2 - Remnant in the book of Isaiah**

### **1. God's Word Defines what is Good and Evil**

**Isaiah 5:20** - Israel had blurred the moral lines between what was right and what was wrong and friends, that is where we are at in this world today. Only the word of God will straighten out what is crooked. God's word is our standard for truth.

**Remnant** - Apart from God, our value system will be upside down. We will be confused as to what is good and what is evil. But God's word is light. We must keep walking in the light. **2 Timothy 3:16-17**




## **2 - Remnant in the book of Isaiah**

### **2. No Matter What, God is Still On His Throne**

**Isaiah 6:1-4** No matter what happens in our world. No matter who is ruling – which nation – which country – which King – which President – no matter if there is a pandemic, an earthquake, or a war... Jesus is still on his throne and he is the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

**Remnant** - Do not give way to fear. I know this world and the things we have to face, can be scary at times. But the King of Kings and Lord of Lords loves you and He is with you. **Matthew 28:20**



## **2 - Remnant in the book of Isaiah**

### **3. 10 Facts about Satan's Fall, Influence & Future**

[Isaiah 14:12-15](#) – we read about Satan before his fall. We see that Lucifer had an “I” problem and wanted to be like God and to sit on the throne of God.

**Remnant** – Consequently Adam and Eve sinned falling to the deception of the Serpent/Lucifer/Satan. In doing so broke all 10 commandments of God. Remnant need to do the commandments of God [Revelation 22:14](#).



## **2 - Remnant in the book of Isaiah**

### **4. God is both Loving and Judgmental**

**Book of Isaiah** - Many people see God as only loving. As we read verse by verse through Isaiah, we can't help but to take note, of chapter after chapter, of prophecy about the coming judgement of these nations.

**Remnant** - Our salvation saves us from the judgement of God. But when we reject Jesus and salvation, we store up judgement on ourselves. **Romans 5:9**



## 2 - *Remnant in the book of Isaiah*

### 5. *When God speaks, it happens*

Isaiah 21:9, it says “Fallen, fallen is Babylon.” When God speaks, it happens. The same fear and trembling that took place when Babylon fell the first time, will also take place one day when God judges the world. We see in Revelation 18:9-20.

**Remnant** - We can trust God’s word and because Isaiah is full of fulfilled prophecy, it is a message of hope and salvation. We see this same repetition and phrase used in Revelation 18:1-2.



## **2 - Remnant in the book of Isaiah**

### **6. Jesus is coming again!**

Isaiah 24:1 opens with the prophecy of God turning the earth upside down and shaking it. In the day that Isaiah was writing, Israel had rebelled against God and judgement was coming.

**Remnant** - In our present day, our world has rebelled against God too. Sin is rampant and very few choose to follow God. There are consequences for sin both in this life and the life to come. [Matthew 16:27](#)




## 2 - *Remnant in the book of Isaiah*

### 7. *Honor God with your heart*

[Isaiah 29:13](#) God's people were pretending to honor God with their lips but their hearts were far from God. Jesus calls people who live this way...hypocrites.

**Remnant** - It is easy to speak eloquently and pretend to be close to God but God sees the heart. And over time when you take a look at the entirety of someone's life, you can detect who is real and authentic — and who is not. [Matthew 15:7-9](#)

## 2 - *Remnant in the book of Isaiah*

### 8. *Muddled Thinking Leads to Muddled Living*

[Isaiah 36](#) we get the narrative of the invasion just as prophesied. As the battle begins, the bigger battle as to who Israel would trust begins to play out. Judah was tempted to trust in Egypt and then the king of Assyria tempted them with food and drink.

**Remnant** - Be on guard. All of the screens around us and social media can muddle our thinking. Stop scrolling on social media and seek God. [Philippians 4:7](#)



## **2 - Remnant in the book of Isaiah**

### **9. Do not give way to fear. God is with you!**

Isaiah 41:10 calls on the nations to see the sovereignty of God. He is the beginning and the end, and everything is always under his control. He commands Israel to not give in to fear because God promises that he is with them.

**Remnant** - It can be scary to feel alone, but as God's children, we are never alone. God is always with us. His love is tender, and he wants to help us. John 14:16




## **2 - Remnant in the book of Isaiah**

### **10. God Will Carry You and Sustain You**

**Isaiah 46:4** This verse assures that God's care and support extend throughout a person's entire life, from infancy (carried since birth) to old age (grey hairs), emphasizing His unwavering commitment to sustain, carry, and rescue them.

**Remnant** - Sometimes heavy loads are put on us that we cannot escape – like health issues, financial issues, a sick friend or relative that needs help or a busy season at work. **1 Peter 5:7**



## 2 - *Remnant in the book of Isaiah*

### 12. *What to Do When God Seems Silent*

[Isaiah 58:4](#) God's people were acting like a nation that was doing all the right things. They seemed to be a people delighting in the nearness of God but they did NOT want the nearness of God.

**Remnant** - The problem was the way they were treating each other. If they were truly seeking the Lord they would not be fighting. They were just going through the motions externally while their hearts were far from God. [John 13:34-35](#)

## 2 - *Remnant in the book of Isaiah*

### 13. *Jesus is a Mighty Warrior & Mighty to Save!*

Isaiah 63:3-4 is a hard passage of scripture to read because Isaiah had a prophetic vision of the Lord's wrath being poured out on his enemies. This is not going to be pretty. And while vengeance is in his heart – redemption and grace are in his heart too!

**Remnant** - 2 Peter 3:9 tells us he is patient and merciful, not wanting any to perish and giving people plenty of time to repent.



## **2 - Remnant in the book of Isaiah**

### **14. The Lord is sovereign over all the earth**

As the book of [Isaiah](#) closes, we see the Lord on his throne in heaven, sovereign over all the earth. The book has a sober ending as Isaiah gives a contrast between those who worship God and those who rebelled and will suffer eternal judgement.

Remnant - In [John 14:26](#), Jesus says he has given us the Holy Spirit as a comforter. He is with us and never leaves us.



# ***3 - Lessons from the Book of Isaiah***

## **God's Holiness & Sovereignty:**

Isaiah reveals God as holy, just, and the Creator of the heavens, calling humanity to look to Him, not idols or self.

## **Sin & Judgment vs. Hope & Restoration:**

While denouncing Israel's apostasy, Isaiah promises judgment but also a future restoration through the coming Messiah, the "Suffering Servant".

## **The Messiah (Jesus Christ):**

Isaiah provides detailed prophecies about Jesus' divine nature, His humble yet glorious coming, His suffering for sin, and His role in establishing God's eternal kingdom.




# **3 - Lessons from the Book of Isaiah**

**Call to Repentance & Obedience:** The book urges people to turn from sin, confess faults, and seek God for healing, emphasizing a transformed heart over mere outward ritual.

**Mission & Witnessing:** God's people are called to be His witnesses, spreading His truth globally, working for justice, and reflecting Christ's character in their daily lives.

**The "Beauty of Holiness":** This isn't self-righteousness but a heart-level principle leading to loving, trusting obedience, empowering believers to bear the cross and follow Jesus.

**God's Word as a Guide:** The Word of God is depicted as a powerful force that cuts away sinful habits, discerns motives, and leads to obedience and peace.




# ***3 - Lessons from the Book of Isaiah***

**Christ-Centered**: A major focus is placed on Isaiah's prophecies as foundational to understanding Jesus' deity and mission.


**End-Time Relevance**: Isaiah's message of a coming Redeemer and the need for a worldwide revival of truth resonates with SDA eschatology (end-time beliefs).

**Practical Holiness**: Lessons emphasize deep faith in Christ, confession, and actively serving others (justice, mercy) as essential to spiritual health.



# Conclusion

The book of Isaiah offers powerful lessons on God's holiness, the need for repentance, the coming Messiah (Jesus Christ) as the ultimate hope, and a call for His people to be witnesses through extensive missionary work, justice, and walking in the "beauty of holiness," revealing God's saving power in a world needing His truth and restoration. Key themes include God's sovereignty, the contrast between sin and righteousness, the promise of a New Jerusalem, and the call to follow Christ's example in service and love.




