

#### Health Benefits of Rutabaga (Seek Medical Advice)



#### Introduction

The book of Deuteronomy contains Moses's final words to the children of Israel before they entered the land of Canaan with Joshua as their leader.


The book's title means "second law" or "repetition of the law" (see Bible Dictionary, "Deuteronomy"), for in these final sermons, Moses repeated to the Israelites many of the laws and commandments that were part of their covenant with the Lord.

Moses also exhorted the Israelites to remember and keep their covenant as he taught them the consequences of either obeying or disobeying the Lord's laws and commandments.



# 1 - Jesus - Temptation in the Wilderness


Jesus used Deuteronomy 6:13, 8:3, and 6:16 to resist the devil's temptations, demonstrating His understanding of the Word & His commitment to God's will.





#### 1 - Jesus - Prophet Like Moses


Deuteronomy 18:15-18 foretells the coming of a prophet like Moses, and Jesus is identified as that prophet. This prophecy emphasizes Jesus's role as a mediator between God and humanity, and His authority to speak God's word.






#### 1 - Jesus - Law and Grace

Deuteronomy emphasizes both God's law and His grace. Jesus's ministry, which included fulfilling the law and offering grace, aligns with this dual focus.








## 1 - Jesus - Love for God and Neighbor


Deuteronomy 6:5, which Jesus cited as the two greatest commandments, are central to His teachings on love.





#### 1 - Jesus - The Covenant

Deuteronomy highlights God's covenant with Israel. Jesus's ministry establishes a new covenant, fulfilling & expanding upon the promises made in Deuteronomy.





#### 1 - Jesus - The Promised Land

Deuteronomy describes the land of Canaan as a place of blessing and provision. Jesus, in a spiritual sense, offers a better "good land" - Himself, a place of rest and provision for believers.





#### 1 - Jesus - Compassion and Justice

Deuteronomy includes teachings about compassion for the vulnerable. Jesus embodied this compassion, particularly in His interactions with the marginalized and oppressed.





# 2 - Remnant - Should you Vote?

#### Deuteronomy 1:13 -

and respected men from each tribe to serve as their leaders.

If I vote in favor of the formation of the image, I shall instructs the Israelites to aid in creating an abomination which will persecute select wise, understanding, the saints of God.... #### 2 - Remnant - The Sin of Leaders

Deuteronomy 3:27 - Nearly 40 years after their sojourn began, the second generation of Israelites rebel again, driving Moses and Aaron to sin.



#### 2 - Remnant - Turn Their Hearts

Deuteronomy 4:29 – God admonishes the children of Israel to hear and obey God.



John 10:27 - "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:"



#### 2 - Remnant - The Covenant: A Better Promise

Deuteronomy 5:2 – God spoke and also gave the hard copy of the 10 commandments to be kept.



John 14:15 - "If ye love me, keep my commandments."



#### 2 - Remnant - Final Generation: Admonitions

Deuteronomy 6:4-5 - Israel's second generation receives warnings as they prepare to enter into the Promised Land.




Revelation 18:4 - And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues.



#### 2 - Remnant - God's People and the Law

Deuteronomy 7:6-12 - God chose Israel as His special people, not because they were numerous or powerful, but because of His love and the promises made to their ancestors.



Revelation 12:17 - This verse highlights the ongoing spiritual conflict between God's chosen people and the forces of evil, emphasizing the importance of steadfastness in faith and obedience to God's word.





## 2 - Remnant - The Sealed People of God

Deuteronomy 8:11-17 - warns the Israelites against forgetting God and attributing their prosperity to their own efforts, rather than recognizing God's provision and power.



Revelation 14:12 - This verse highlights the characteristics of true believers during a time of tribulation.




#### 2 - Remnant – Remember, Do Not Forget

Deuteronomy 9:7 - a reminder to the Israelites of their past rebellions against God, specifically during their journey through the wilderness after leaving Egypt.



Mark 8:38 - a strong warning about the consequences of denying or being ashamed of Jesus and his teachings, especially in the face of opposition or persecution.




#### 2 - Remnant - Judgement of God

Deuteronomy 10:18 - emphasizes God's justice and compassion, particularly for the vulnerable and marginalized.


God shows love to the foreigners living among you and gives them food and clothing. So you, too, must show love to foreigners. **DEUT. 10:18-19** 

Matthew 25:43 - emphasizes the importance of practical acts of love and service towards others, particularly the vulnerable.



#### 2 - Remnant - Weapons in the Church

Deuteronomy 11:18-21 - instructs the Israelites to internalize God's commands, making them a part of their daily lives and teaching them to their children.




Ephesians 6:11 - emphasizes the need for Christians to be fully equipped with God's spiritual armour to resist the devil's deceptive tactics and schemes.



## 2 - Remnant - Missing the Mark

Deuteronomy 13:4 - instructs the Israelites to follow, revere, obey, serve, and cleave to the Lord their God.

Deuteronomy 13:4 "Serve only the Lord your God and fear Him alone. Obey His commands, listen to His voice, and cling to Him." Luke 16:1-13 - using worldly resources wisely and prioritizing spiritual wealth over material possessions.




The parable of the shrewd manager Luke 16:1-13




## 2 - Remnant - Holy & Peculiar People

Deuteronomy 14:2 - emphasizes the Israelites' unique status as God's chosen and holy people, set apart from all other nations.



1 Peter 2:9 - Christians are selected by God, set apart for His purposes, and called to reflect His character and share His message.





## 2 - Remnant - Instruction to Help the Poor

Deuteronomy 15:7-11 - instructs Israelites to be generous and compassionate towards their poor countrymen, particularly when lending money.




James 1:27 - "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their distress,...



And the King will say: I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me! Matthew 25:40

## 2 - Remnant - Astrology is Idolatry

Deuteronomy 17:2-3 - in a community that follows God's commands, there is no room for wickedness or transgression.



Revelation 14:9-12 - describes the consequences for those who worship the beast and has its name number and receive its mark.



#### 2 - Remnant - Magic Tricks

Deuteronomy 18:10-12 - prohibits various forms of occult practices, magic and divination, witchcraft, soothsaying, and consulting with mediums or spirits.




Revelation 22:15 - describes those who will not inherit eternal life, specifically excluding those who practice evil.



# 2 - Remnant - Need 2 or 3 Witnesses

Deuteronomy 19:15-21 - establishes a legal principle that a person cannot be convicted of a crime based on the testimony of only one witness.



Acts 1:8 - emphasizes the role of the Holy Spirit in empowering believers to share their faith to all around.




#### 2 - Remnant - Instruction on Inheritance

Deuteronomy 21:15-17 - It stipulates that the firstborn son, even from the disliked wife, inherits the birthright.




Galatians 3:28 - which states there is no distinction in Christ based on ethnicity, social status, or gender,



## 2 - Remnant - Women & Men's Clothing

Deuteronomy 22:5 - a prohibition against cross-dressing, specifically stating that a woman should not wear men's clothing, nor a man wear women's clothing.



1 Timothy 2:9 - which instructs women to "dress modestly, with decency, not with hairstyles, gold or pearls, or expensive clothes.






#### 2 - Remnant - Backslidden People

Deuteronomy 23:3-6 - refers to their exclusion from certain religious and civic leadership roles within Israelite society due to ones past hostility and lack of hospitality.




Romans 8:20 - teaches believers to respond to animosity with kindness and generosity, aiming to prompt repentance in their enemies rather than seeking revenge.



#### 2 - Remnant - Lending to the Poor

Deuteronomy 24:10-13 - outlines guidelines for handling a pledge taken as collateral for a loan, emphasizing respect for the borrower and their property.



Luke 3:10-11 - urges to share resources with those in need, emphasizing practical acts of generosity and compassion as tangible expressions of faith.

#### **LUKE 3:11**

John answered,
"Anyone who has two shirts should share with the one who has none,

and anyone who has food should do the same."





#### 2 - Remnant - Tithe & Offerings

Deuteronomy 26:10-12 - outlines the procedure for offering firstfruits and tithes to God.


Giving God our Best... Not what's Left "Honor the Lord with your possession, and with the first fruits of all your increase; so that your barns will be filled with plenty and your vats will overflow with new wine." Proverbs 3:9-10

2 Corinthians 9:7 - highlights that giving should be a joyful act motivated by the giver's own decision, not out of obligation or a begrudging spirit.




# 2 - Remnant - 2<sup>nd</sup> part of 10 Commandments

Deuteronomy 27:15-26 - outlines a series of twelve curses, each pronounced upon those who violate specific commandments of God's law.



Revelation 22:14 - a blessing upon those who obey God's commandments, granting them access to eternal life in the New Jerusalem.



#### 2 - Remnant - Promises & Curses of God

Deuteronomy 28:1-68 - presents a powerful contrast between the blessings promised for obedience to God and the curses threatened for disobedience.

# ACCORDING TO DEUTERONOMY BLESSINGS CURSES

- Blessed coming in and going out
  - Financial Prosperity
    - Blessed Health
  - Everything You Own Will Be Blessed
  - Victory over enemies

- Cursed coming in and going out
  - Cursed Prosperity (Poverty)
  - Disease and Illness
  - Cursed Crops and Finances
  - Oppression by Enemies

Revelation 22:3 - signifies the complete removal of the curse that entered the world through sin and the restoration of God's original design for humanity.

No longer will there be any curse. The throne of God and of the Lamb will be in the city, and his servants will serve him.

#### 2 - Remnant - God reveals Secrets

Deuteronomy 29:29 - means we should focus on the truths God has made clear in His Word, and accept that some things are beyond our comprehension.




Colossians 2:2 - emphasizes the importance of unity and love among believers, particularly in the context of understanding the "mystery of God".




#### 2 - Remnant - Spiritual Revival

Deuteronomy 30:16 - God again commands the Israelites to love Him, walk in His ways, and keep His commandments, statutes, and judgments.



Revelation 14:12 - highlights the characteristics of those who have both obedience to God's commands and faith in Jesus Christ.




#### 2 - Remnant - Law in side of Ark of Covenant

Deuteronomy 31:26 - instructs the Levites to place the book of the law beside the Ark of the Covenant which housed the Ten Commandments.




Colossians 2:14-17 - the ceremonial laws and practices of the Old Testament including the ceremonial sabbaths and festivals are nailed to the Cross.




#### 2 - Remnant - Jesus the Rock

Deuteronomy 32:4 - emphasizes God's flawless nature, perfect work, just ways, righteous character, His immutability, integrity, and unwavering commitment to justice and truth.



Matthew 16:18 - The "rock" refers to Jesus himself and the truth of his identity as the Messiah. The forces of evil and death, will not overcome the church.




### 2 - Remnant - Special Resurrection

Deuteronomy 34:5-10 - describes the death of Moses and that there had not arisen a prophet since Moses like him, whom the Lord knew face to face. Jesus resurrected him, took to heaven.

**Jude 1:9** "But even the archangel Michael," when he was disputing with the devil about the body of Moses, did not dare bring a slanderous accusation about him, but said, "The Lord rebuke you!"


Revelation 14:13 - speaks of the blessedness of those who die in the Lord under the 3 angels' messages. (they will raise in special resurrection)




#### Conclusion


Had Israel obeyed the directions given them by Moses, not one of those who started on the journey from Egypt would in the wilderness have fallen a prey to disease or death. They were under a safe Guide. Christ had pledged Himself to lead them safely to the promised land if they would follow His guidance. This vast multitude, numbering more than a million people, was under His direct rule. They were His family. In every one of them He was interested (Manuscript 144, 1903).
