Health benefits of Scallions:


- 1. Has organosulfur compounds and flavonoids which inhibit cancer cell growth and protect cells from damage.






Introduction



1 - Jesus in the book of Ruth Ruth: Never Let Me Go


1. Ruth, a Moabite woman chose to leave her homeland and cleave to Naomi her mother-in-law of Israel. - Ruth 1:16-17

Call of Gentiles to leave their former ways and become part of God's chosen people through faith in Jesus Christ. - Ephesians 3:6




1 - Jesus in the book of Ruth (cont'd) Ruth: Never Let Me Go (cont'd)

2. Ruth's faith and obedience to Naomi lead her to Boaz and ultimately essential for receiving the blessings to redemption. - Ruth 1:16




Similarly, faith and obedience are of salvation through Jesus. - 2 Thessalonians 2:13




1 - Jesus in the book of Ruth (cont'd) Ruth: Never Let Me Go (cont'd)

The character of Jesus Christ is of sacrificial love and servant-hearted nature. – John 15:13




1 - Jesus in the book of Ruth (cont'd) Ruth: Never Let Me Go (cont'd)




2 - Remnant in the book of Ruth 1. Loss is hard

Naomi from Bethlehem moved to Moab lost her husband and two sons. Left with 2 daughters-in-law to fend for themselves. - Ruth 1



Many times, even the Remnant while dealing with grief we too can feel lost or forgotten. - Psalm 56:8-9




2 - Remnant in the book of Ruth (cont'd) 2. Keep Your Commitments

While Orpah took the option to leave, Ruth decided to commit to stay with Naomi instead of looking to her own interests. - Ruth 1:16

Have we made choices to be in a place that we "think" will give us what we want, instead of following God's direction? - Matthew 24:15-16





2 - Remnant in the book of Ruth (cont'd) 3. Bitterness Happens

"Call me Mara, because the Almighty has made my life very bitter. I went away full, but the Lord has brought me back empty. - Ruth 1:20-21



Have you ever felt that way? Bitter and mad at God for what may feel like a ruined life? The Remnant will experience it. – Matthew 10:21-23






2 - Remnant in the book of Ruth (cont'd) 4. Get to Work

Ruth was in a new town, with new people, and wanted to help take care of Naomi and herself, so went to glean in the fields. - Ruth 2:2-7



The Remnant is admonished to work while it is still day for the night (2nd Coming) is coming when no man can work anymore. - John 9:4



2 - Remnant in the book of Ruth (cont'd) 5. The Diligent Worker was Noticed

It is observed by Boaz that Ruth was hard working, probably sweating and diligently toiling all day long. - Ruth 2:5



God wants the Remnant to be His witnesses in all the world for them to know Jesus and prepare to meet Him. – Matthew 24:14



2 - Remnant in the book of Ruth (cont'd) 6. Ruth found favour with Man (Boaz)

Boaz tells Ruth to not glean in another field, but to stay with the women who work for him to be protected from any harm. - Ruth 2:8

If the Remnant live Christ-like lives and receive the Seal of God, they too will find favour with man. - Luke 2:52. Also see Revelation 9:5.



2 - Remnant in the book of Ruth (cont'd) 7. Ruth Made a Move

Naomi told Ruth to get dressed up in best clothes and perfume and go to Boaz. Ruth went and was lying at his feet when he was asleep - Ruth 3:6-9


The call is for the all who are faithful servants (Remnant) to come to Jesus and enter into His kingdom.-Revelation 22:17.



2 - Remnant in the book of Ruth (cont'd) 8. Noble Character is Needed


Boaz knew another man was in line ahead, he offered him to take over Naomi, Ruth and her Land. When he refused Boaz obliged. – Ruth 4

A noble character is needed for the Remnant to be counted in the living 144,000, who will enter heaven when Jesus comes. - Revelation 14:1-5




2 - Remnant in the book of Ruth (cont'd) 9. Boaz Takes Care of Business

Boaz without following emotions wanted to make sure what is right to be done under all circumstances and eventually got his desire. - Ruth 4




Remnant are to obey God and do His commandments so that they can get their desire of going with Jesus when he comes. - Revelation 22:14



2 - Remnant in the book of Ruth (cont'd) 10. Our choice determine our destiny

Boaz purchased the land, married Ruth and had a son Obed, who had a son Jesse, who had a son David, leading on to Jesus. - Ruth 4:13-22



Remnant overcome Satan, sin and second death, they will be married to Jesus and will be with Him for ever and ever. - Revelation 19-22



3 - Lessons from the book of Ruth 1. Loyalty and Commitment:

Ruth's unwavering loyalty to Naomi:

Despite facing personal hardship and cultural differences, Ruth chose to stay with Naomi, demonstrating a deep commitment and loyalty that is a hallmark of the book.

Application for Remnant:

This resonates with the Adventist call for loyalty to God and His church, even in challenging times.




3 - Lessons from the book of Ruth (cont'd) 2. God's Grace and Redemption:

God's grace extends to all people:

Ruth, a Moabite, was chosen by God to be part of the lineage of David and ultimately Jesus, demonstrating that God's grace is not limited by ethnicity or background.

Application for Remnant:

This reinforces the Adventist understanding of God's universal love and the inclusivity of His salvation.

Application for Remnant:

This encourages Adventists to recognize God's presence and guidance in their daily lives, even in seemingly small or insignificant moments.




Conclusion 5. Faithfulness and Obedience:

Ruth's faithfulness leads to blessings:


Ruth's willingness to embrace God's will and follow His guidance results in blessings for her and her descendants.

Application for Remnant:


This reinforces the importance of obedience to God's commandments and faithfulness in following His will, trusting that He will bless those who do.
