



Health Benefits of Purslane (Seek Medical Advice)

Purslane is green leafy vegetable with 93% water, eaten raw or cooked. Known as Portulaca oleracea, pigweed, hogweed, fatweed and pusley. It has red stems, small green leaves and slightly sour or salty taste, similar to spinach and watercress.







Introduction

Key points in the book of Nehemiah include Nehemiah's leadership in rebuilding Jerusalem's walls through prayer, perseverance, and strategic planning, even while facing opposition.

The book also emphasizes the importance of personal and communal repentance, adherence to God's law, covenant renewal, the observance of the Sabbath, and a commitment to moral and spiritual reform, such as dissolving mixed marriages.



Introduction - Leadership and Rebuilding

Prayerful leadership: Nehemiah consistently turns to God in prayer for guidance and strength before taking action.

Perseverance: He shows courage and tenacity in the face of intimidation, ridicule, and threats while leading the project to rebuild the walls.

Strategic planning: Nehemiah organizes the people to work efficiently, with each group assigned to a specific section of the wall, leading to its completion in a remarkably short time.




Introduction - Spiritual Revival and Reform

Repentance: Nehemiah leads the community in acknowledging sin and renewing their covenant with God.

Adherence to God's law: He enforces laws like the observance of the Sabbath and works to restore proper worship and tithing.

Moral and spiritual purity:

Nehemiah addresses issues like usury and dissolving marriages to non-Jewish partners to maintain the spiritual integrity of the community.



Introduction - Community and Character

Humility: Nehemiah's leadership is marked by humility and a focus on serving others rather than enriching himself.

Motivation: He inspires and motivates the people to have a common goal and to work together toward rebuilding the city.


Covenant renewal: The book concludes with a public covenant where leaders and people commit to walking in God's law.

6. Nehemiah acted as a mediator between God and the people, and between the people and the king. Nehemiah 1:4-9






1 - Jesus in the book of Nehemiah Prophecy Fulfilment

Jesus's crucifixion is a fulfilment of biblical prophecy and a demonstration of the Bible's reliability as a historical and prophetic record. John 19:23-24




1 - Jesus in the book of Nehemiah A perfect Priest

Jesus is the perfect, great High Priest whose sacrifice on the cross provides atonement for sin. Hebrews 10:12






1 - Jesus in the book of Nehemiah A devoted Teacher







1 - Jesus in the book of Nehemiah A Spiritual Reformer



15. The rebuilding of the Sheep Gate, the closest gate to the temple. Nehemiah 3:1





1. Nehemiah's desire to rebuild came from God, inspiring his resolve. Nehemiah 2:18






2 - Remnant in the book of Nehemiah Grief before Action

2. Upon hearing the news of Jerusalem's ruin, Nehemiah wept, mourned, and fasted for days before acting. Nehemiah 1:4




Remnant are admonished to not take sin lightly but with godly sorrow to confront it with sincere contrition and humility. James 4:9–10




2 - Remnant in the book of Nehemiah Repentant Intercession




Remnant must start with humility and repentance, acknowledging that all have fallen short. Romans 3:23

4. Nehemiah surveyed the damaged walls to understand the full scope of the project. Nehemiah 2:12–16.




Remnant are encouraged to action and planning to give the gospel to the world. Colossians 4:5–6




Remnant must trust in God's provision and sovereignty, even when utilizing worldly opportunities. Romans 8:28




2 - Remnant in the book of Nehemiah Tenacious Focus on the Mission

9. Despite repeated attempts by his enemies to distract him and undermine the work, Nehemiah refused to be sidetracked. Nehemiah 6:3




Remnant must not lose focus on its divine calling, no matter the distraction. Hebrews 12:1–2

10. With the wall complete, Nehemiah and Ezra led the people in a period of spiritual revival. Nehemiah 8:1-18




The mission of a remnant extends beyond practical tasks to the restoration of spiritual life and faithfulness. Acts 3:19

11. Nehemiah addressed social and spiritual failures, such as usury, Sabbath desecration, and intermarriage with foreign people. Nehemiah 13


This demonstrates that the remnant's work is holistic, addressing both physical and spiritual health. 1 Corinthians 6:19–20




2 - Remnant in the book of Nehemiah Heartfelt grief over Sin

16. Upon learning of the people's sin, Ezra was deeply grieved, tore his clothes, and fell before God in anguish. Nehemiah 8:9–11




Remnant need to see sin as God does—as a tragic act of faithlessness that grieves His Holy Spirit. Ephesians 4:30




2 - Remnant in the book of Nehemiah Intercessory Confession

Remnant must pray with the same burden for the transgressions of God's people, standing in the gap on their behalf. Ephesians 6:18




2 - Remnant in the book of Nehemiah Radical separation from worldly influence

18. Ezra's prayer culminated in the people making a painful covenant to separate from the foreign wives and their pagan influences. Ezra 10:3



Remnant must make costly sacrifices to remove any worldly pollution that compromises their loyalty to God. Romans 12:1–2



2 - Remnant in the book of Nehemiah Trust in God's sovereignty

19. The book of Nehemiah emphasizes that God is sovereign over all, even using pagan kings like Cyrus to accomplish His purposes. Nehemiah 2:8

Remnant can find peace in this truth, knowing that no worldly power can prevent God's plans from being fulfilled. Acts 5:38–39







2 - Remnant in the book of Nehemiah Rely on the Spirit's power

20. The work of restoration was not driven by human might but by God stirring the spirits of His people.

Nehemiah 2:18



Remnant must remember that true revival is always God's work, empowered by His Spirit. Acts 1:8



3 - Lessons: Prayer and Purpose

Identify and respond to needs:
Nehemiah was moved by the news of Jerusalem's broken walls, leading him to mourn, fast, and pray, demonstrating a burden for the needs of the people and a call to action.

Pray for favor and provision:

Nehemiah prayed for favour with the king, who then provided resources for the rebuilding project, showing that God can provide in ways beyond human imagination.

Be a person of prayer and action: Like Nehemiah, believers are called to both prayer and action, recognizing that salvation and rebuilding are dependent on God's power.

3 - Lessons: Diligence and Perseverance

Plan and work diligently: Nehemiah spent time carefully planning before starting the rebuilding, and the people showed a "mind to work," demonstrating diligence in their tasks.

Recognize opposition: The rebuilding project faced significant opposition, but Nehemiah and the people were reminded to focus on God's strength and fight for their families.

Persevere through hardship:
Rebuilding a wall is not a quick or easy task. The process of building brick by brick can strengthen character, perseverance, and hope, which is an eternal hope that does not disappoint.



3 - Lessons: Unity and Leadership

Work together as a team: The people worked together to rebuild the wall, which unified them and encouraged them to keep working despite their differences, similar to how believers today should unite to build for God.

Lead through service: Nehemiah's leadership was characterized by selfless service; he refused payment that was rightfully his and shared his table with the people.

Embrace leadership in every role:

Everyone is a leader in some capacity, whether in the home, community, or ministry. The key is to recognize the potential in people and ideas and have the courage to develop it.




Conclusion


The remnant can learn to prioritize God's vision, work as a team, maintain perseverance, and recognize that rebuilding requires both faith and action.
