Health Snippet – Apple

Health Benefits of Apple (Seek Medical Advice)

Apples are most widely consumed fruit globally. From sweet red varieties to tangy green ones, there is an apple for all.

Pembrokeshire, Wales, UK proverb: "***Eat an apple on going to bed, and you'll keep the doctor from earning his bread,***" was recorded in Notes and Queries magazine in 1866.

Heart Health: soluble fiber helps lower cholesterol, while polyphenols lower blood pressure and reduced stroke risk.

Weight Management: High fiber and water content increase fullness, making them an effective that can reduce BMI.

Diabetes Prevention: can lower risk of type 2 diabetes, due to high polyphenol and fiber that stabilizes blood sugar.

Gut Health: The pectin fiber in apples acts as a prebiotic, feeding beneficial bacteria in the gut.

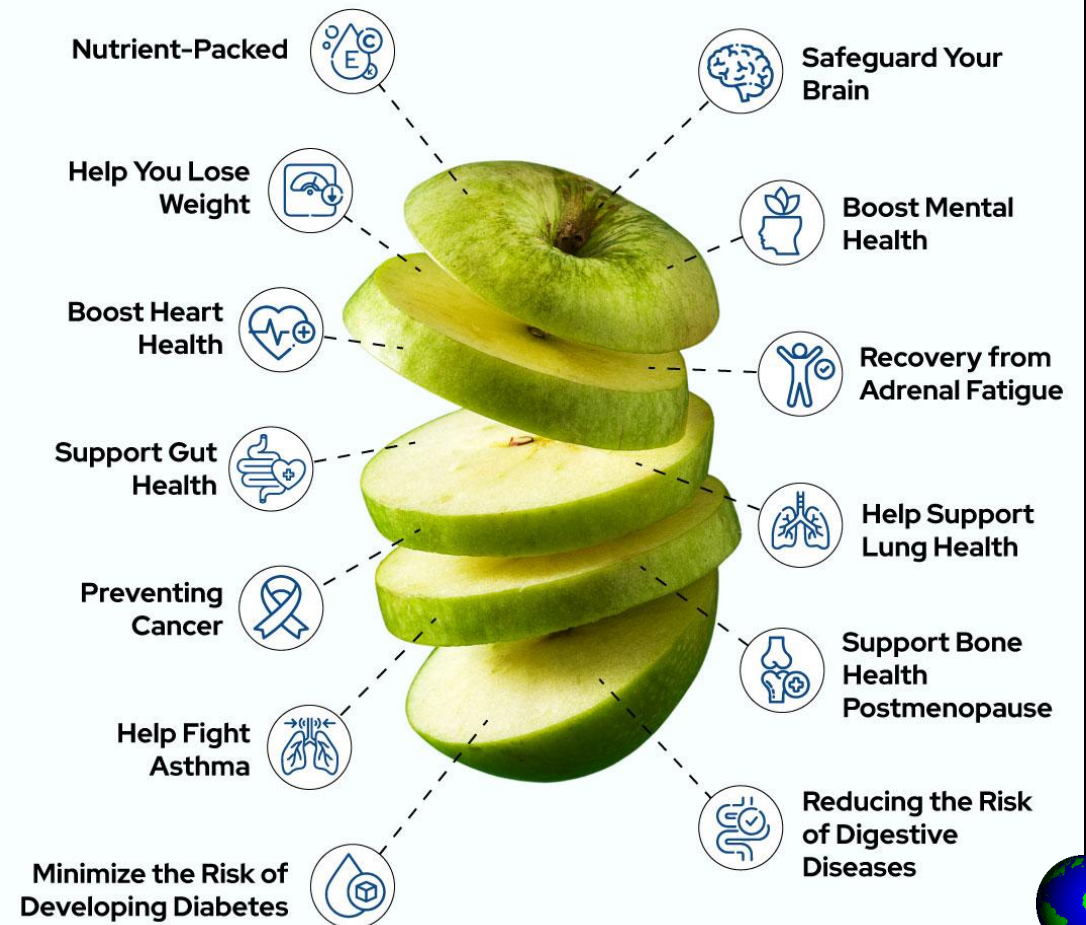
Nutrient Dense: They are a good source of Vitamin C, potassium, and antioxidants, located in the peel.

Cancer Prevention: Antioxidant and anti-inflammatory properties can reduce the risk of certain cancers.

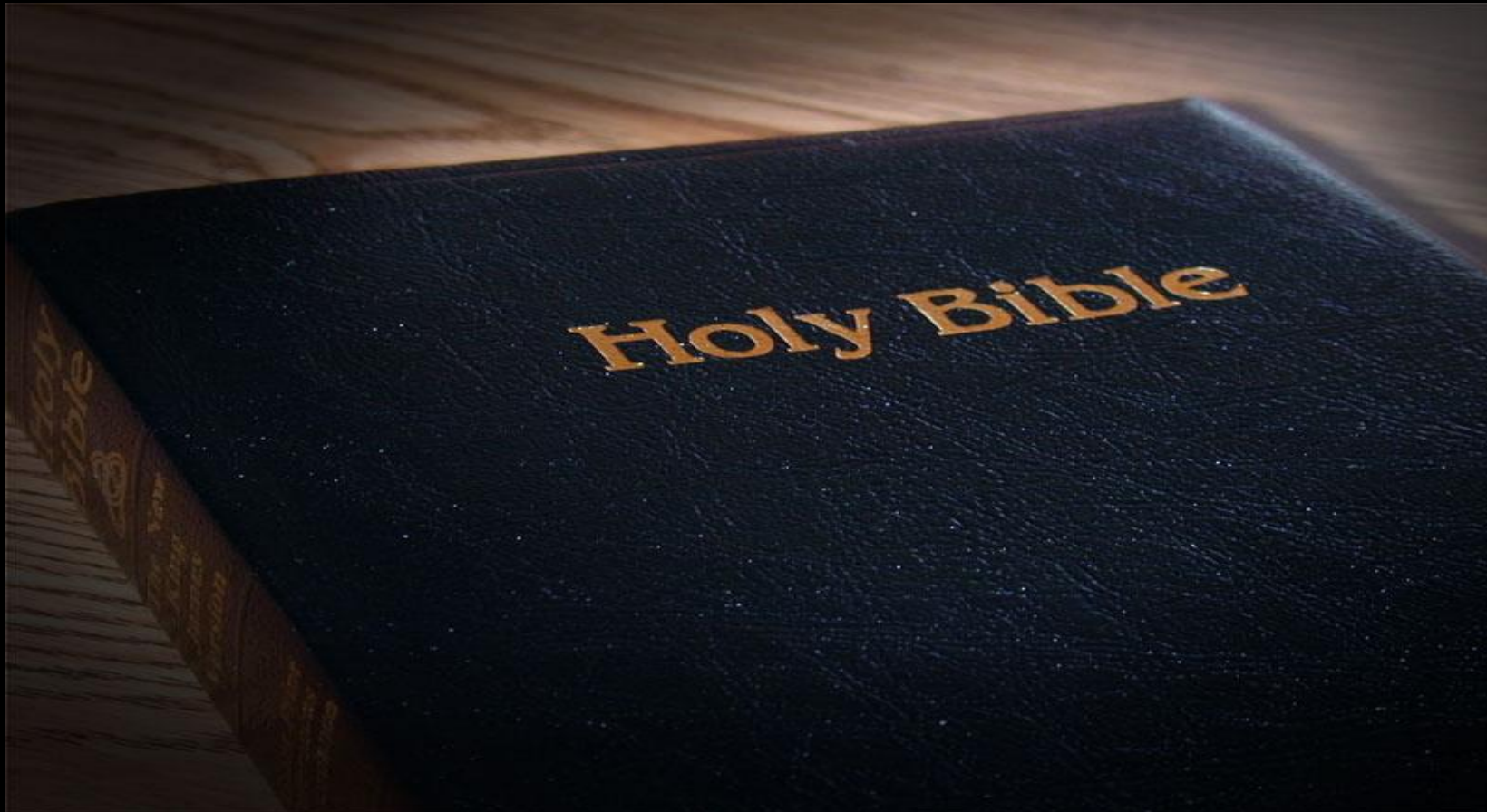
Bone Health: The antioxidant and anti-inflammatory compounds in apples can promote better bone density.

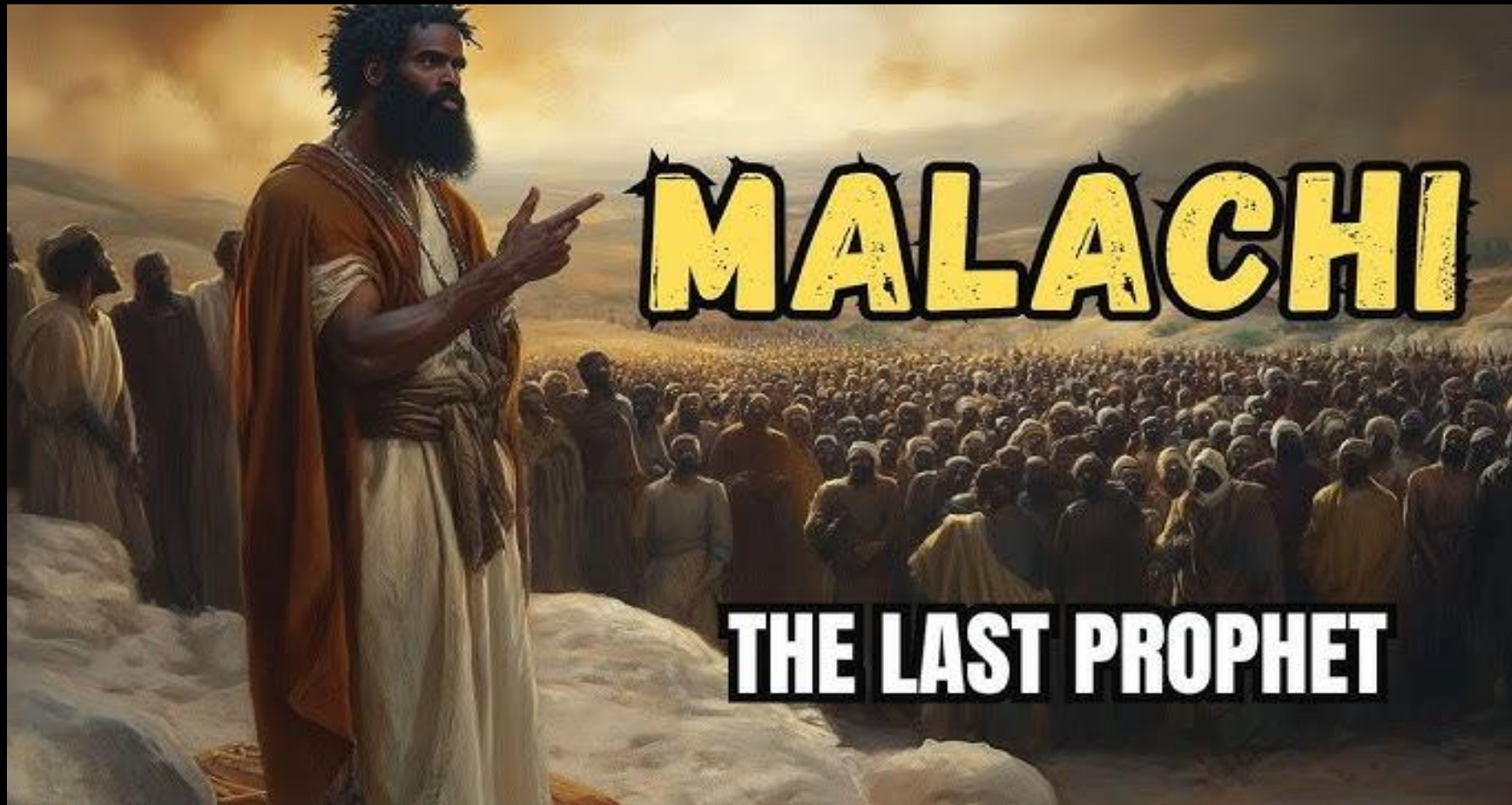

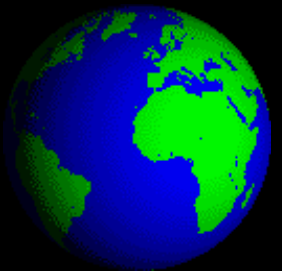

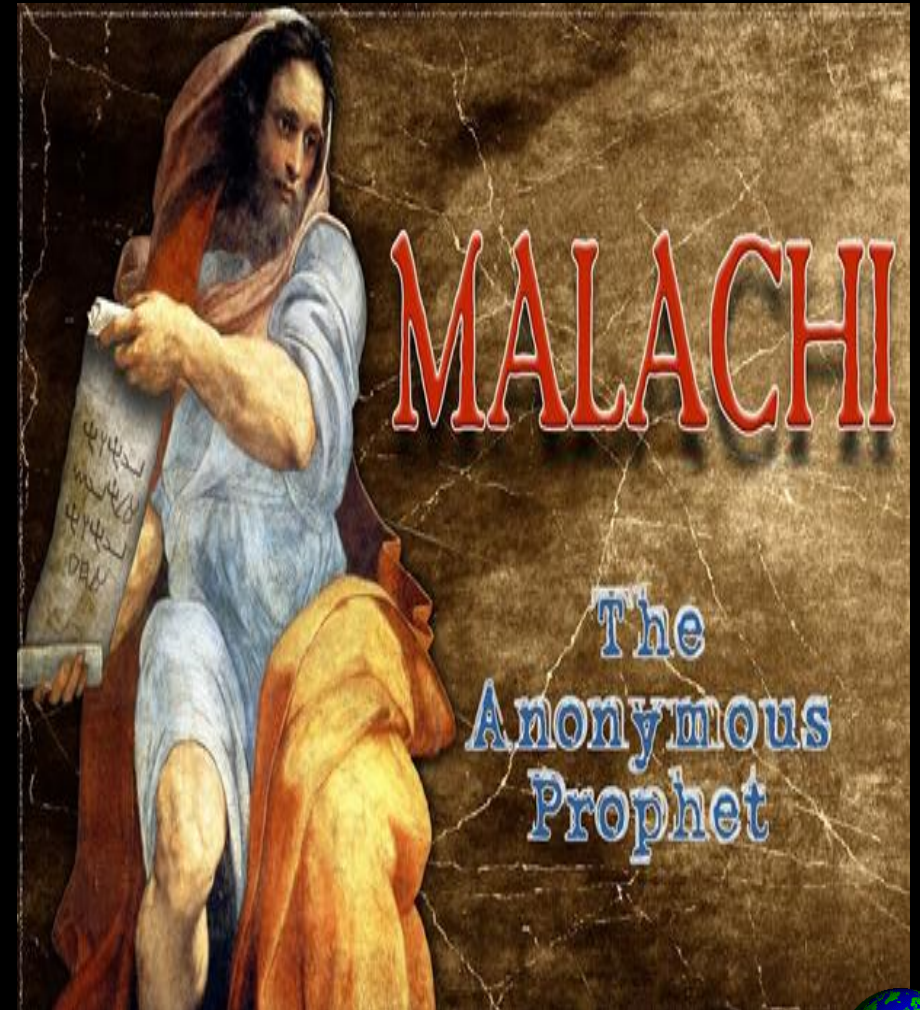
Introduction

1. The Call to True Repentance and Faithfulness

Malachi addresses a generation that, despite having returned from Babylonian exile and rebuilt the Temple, had become disillusioned, cynical, and indifferent to God. The central message is a call to "Return to Me, and I will return to you" ([Malachi 3:7](#)).

Heartfelt Worship vs. Formalism: The people were going through the motions of worship but offering "lame" and "sick" sacrifices, reflecting a lack of true devotion.

Covenant Violations: God accuses the people of breaking their covenant through divorce, intermarriage with idolators, and social injustice.



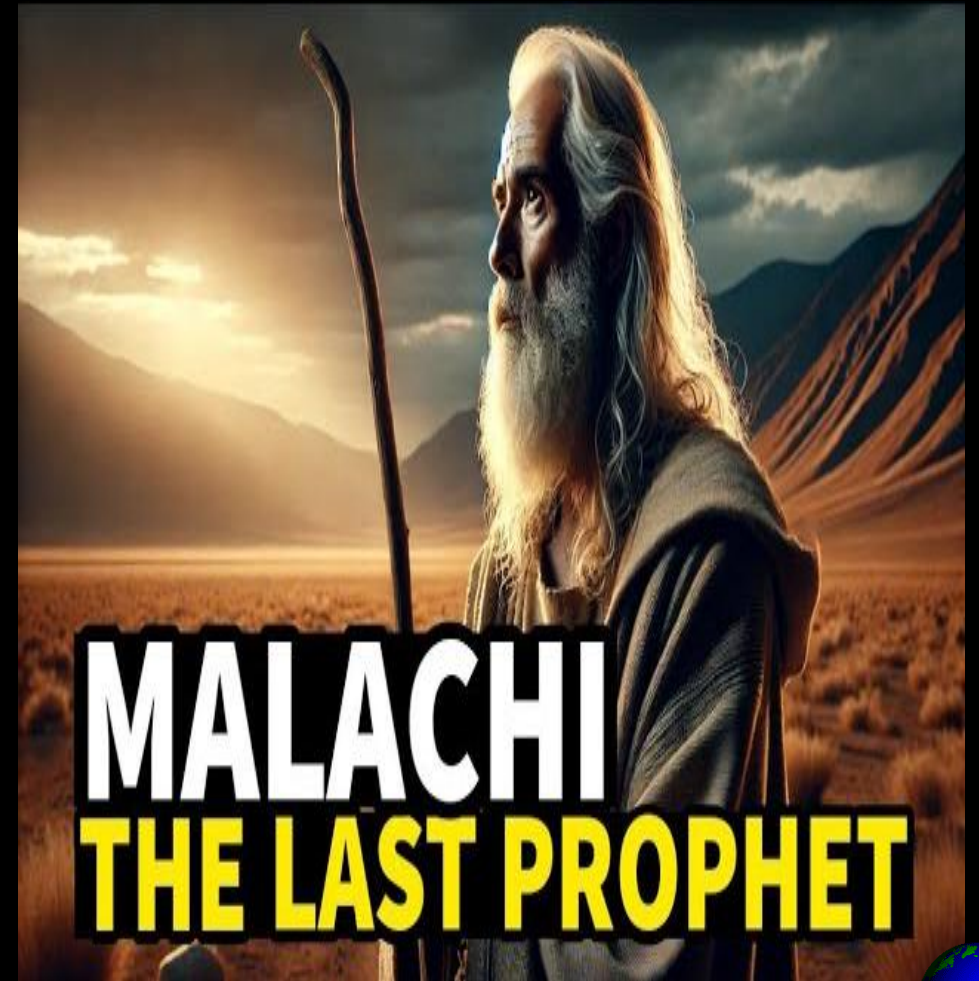

2. Role of the Priesthood and Spiritual Leadership

Malachi heavily rebukes the priests for failing to teach the law properly and for allowing corrupt worship to continue.

Corruption in Ministry: The leaders are condemned for partiality in teaching the law and for treating their sacred duties as a "burden".

The Ideal Priest: The prophet upholds an ideal where the priest is a messenger of the Lord, accurately teaching the law and turning many from iniquity ([Malachi 2:7](#)).

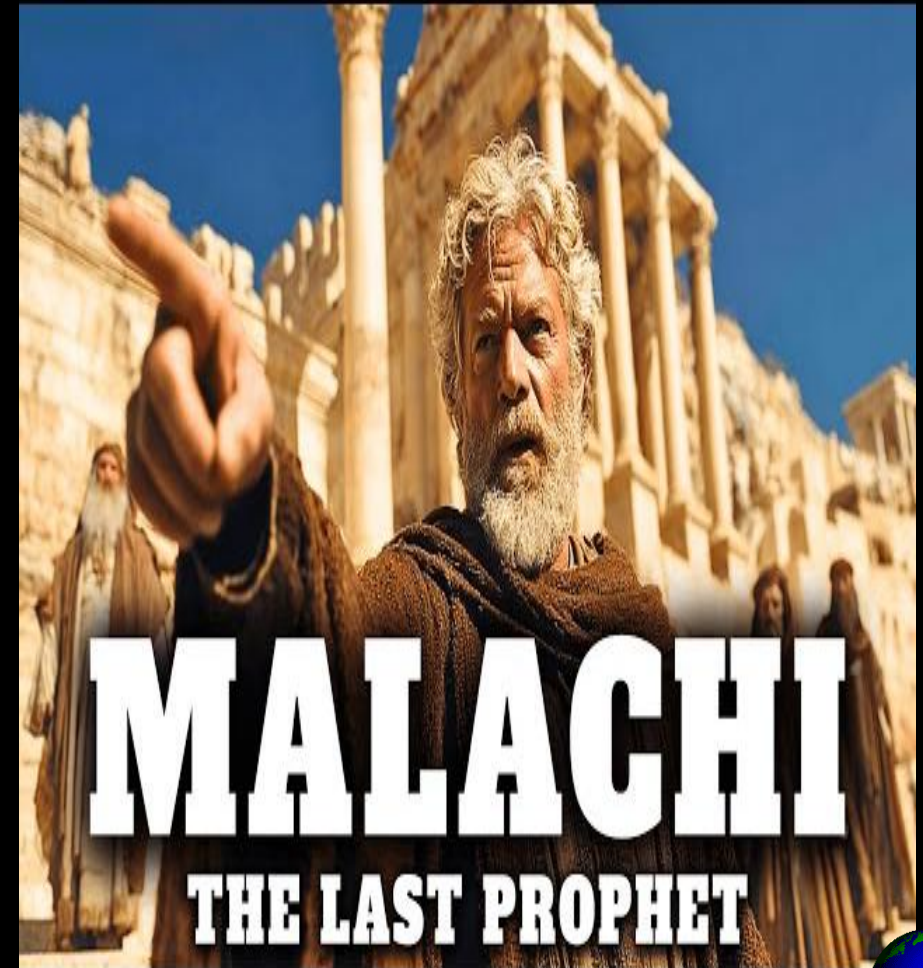

3. Tithing and Faithful Stewardship

Malachi 3:8-10 is a central passage in the stewardship theology, accusing the people of "robbing God" by withholding tithes and offerings.

Trust and Blessing: The refusal to tithe is viewed as a lack of trust in God's provision. The call to bring the "whole tithe into the storehouse" is accompanied by a promise of divine blessing and protection.



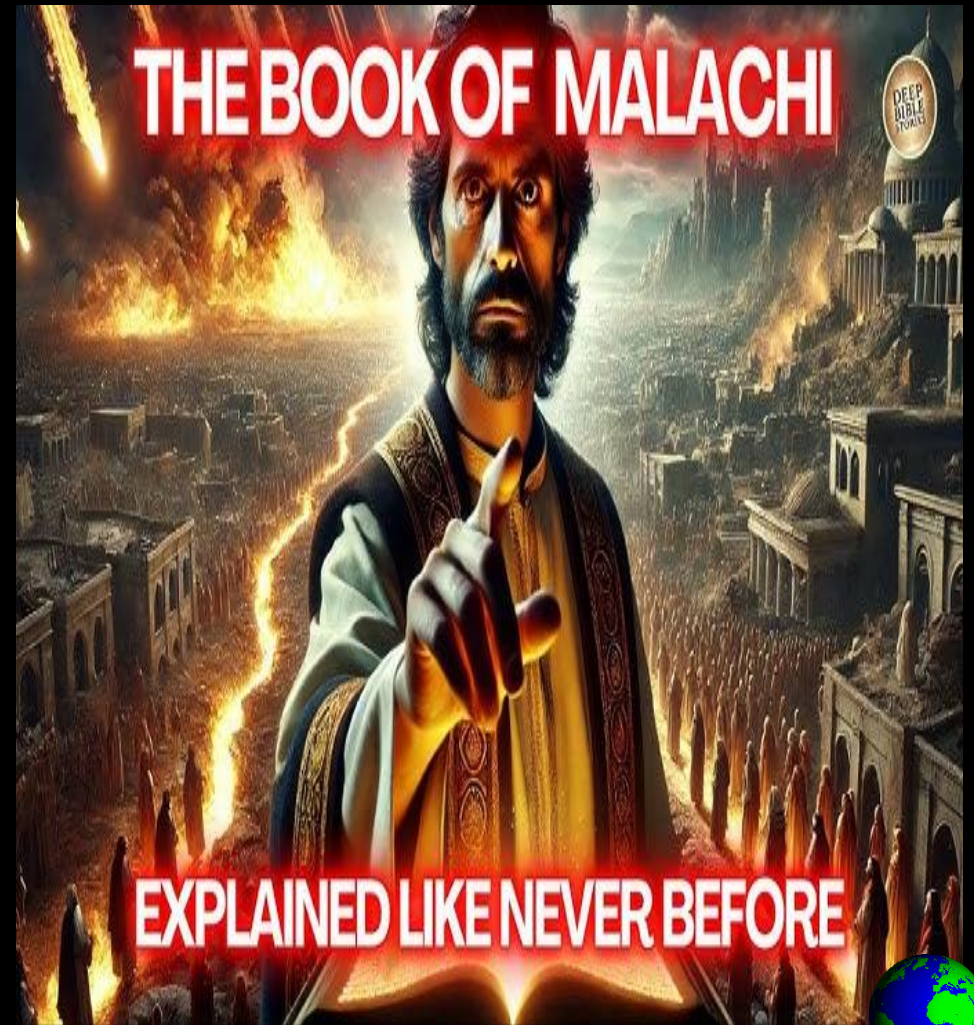

4. *The Day of the Lord and Final Judgment*

The Refiner's Fire: Christ is portrayed as a purifier who will cleanse the "sons of Levi," a reference interpreted as pointing toward the work of Christ in the heavenly sanctuary—the investigative judgment.

The Book of Remembrance: A "book of remembrance" is written for those who fear the Lord and meditate on His name, promising that they will be spared in the final judgment.

Destruction of the Wicked: The prophecy describes the wicked being burned up as stubble, leaving neither root nor branch—a view consistent with the conditional immortality (the annihilation of the wicked).

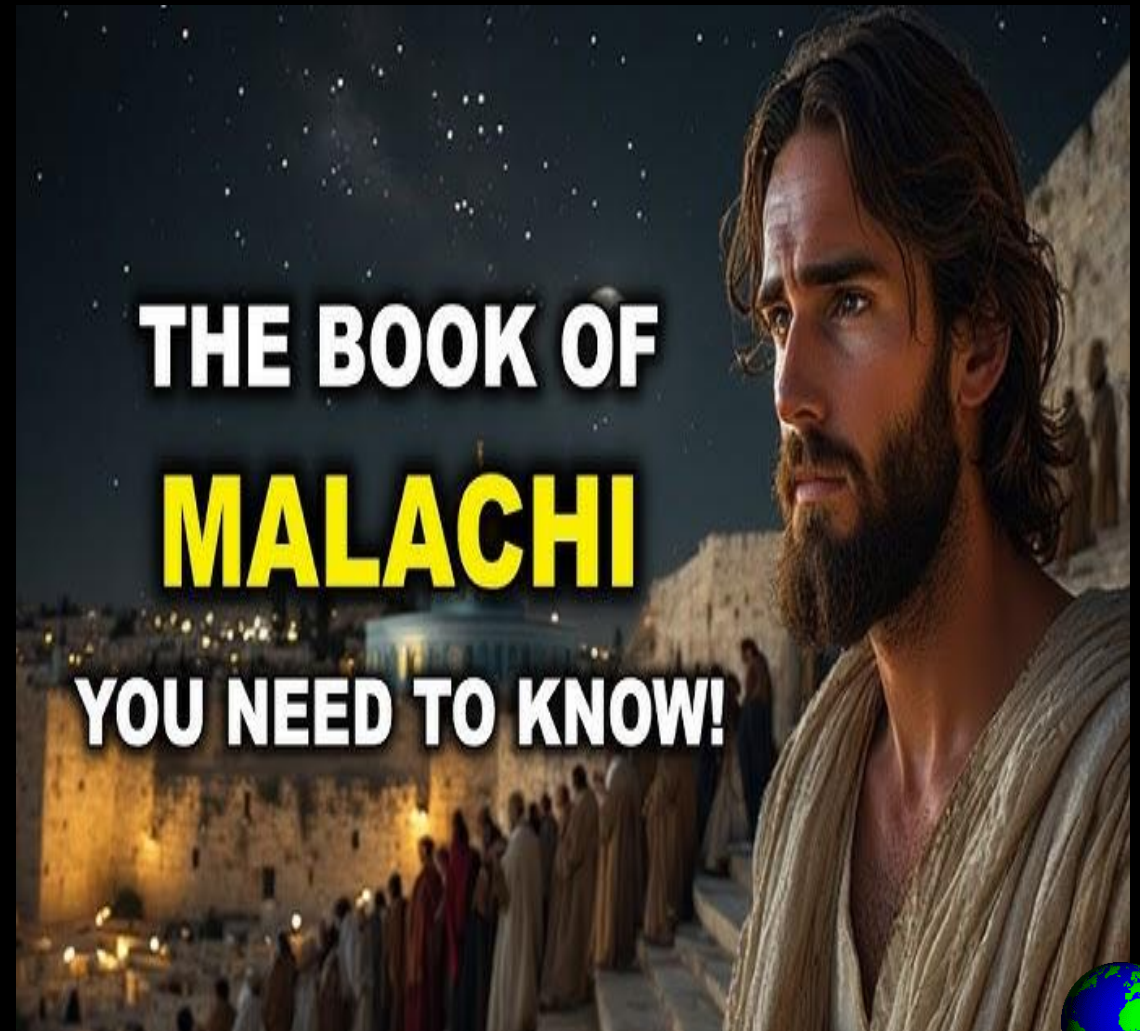
5. The Elijah Message and Preparation

The book concludes with the promise to send "Elijah the prophet" before the coming of the "great and dreadful day of the Lord" ([Malachi 4:5-6](#)).

John the Baptist and the End-Time:

While John the Baptist fulfilled this role in his time, SDA theology views this as a prophetic commission for a last-day message, preparing a people for the second coming of Jesus.

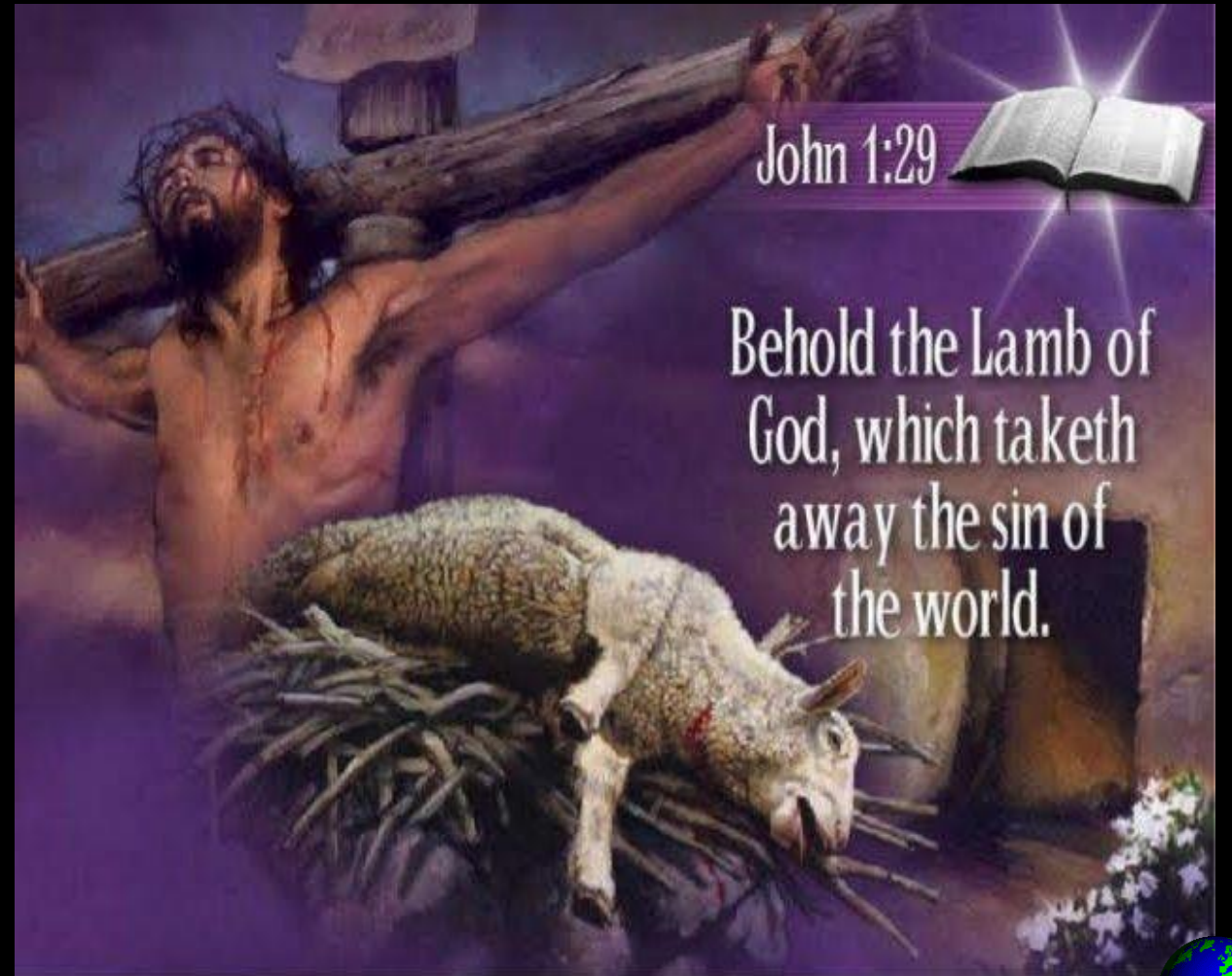
Restoration: The work of "Elijah" is to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children and the children to their fathers, restoring true worship and covenant relationship.



1 - Jesus in the book of Malachi

1. The Perfect Sacrifice -Pointing to Christ (**Malachi 1:8**)

The priests in Malachi 1 offered "blind," "lame," and "diseased" animals. These sacrifices were supposed to point forward to Jesus, the spotless Lamb of God (**John 1:29**).

2. The "Pure Offering" Among Gentiles (*Malachi 1:11*)

"...in every place incense shall be offered to My name, and a pure offering." *Malachi 1:11*

This "pure offering" as the spiritual sacrifices of praise and the proclamation of the gospel, authorized by Christ's final sacrifice.

Matthew 28:19-20



1 - Jesus in the book of Malachi

3. God's Unchanging Love (*Malachi 1:2-5*)

God declares "I have loved you" (*1:2*).

This love is demonstrated through grace—choosing a rebellious people, much like Christ loves sinners. *Romans 5:8*

4. The "Great King" (Malachi 1:14)

God calls Himself a "great King" whose name is to be feared among the nations.

Jesus is the fulfillment of this King—the divine Son who deserves full honor. [John 5:23](#)



1 - Jesus in the book of Malachi

5. Jesus as the True Priest (*Malachi 2:1–9*)

Malachi 2 condemns the priests of his day for departing from the way, causing many to stumble, and breaking the covenant of Levi.

Jesus is the faithful fulfillment of the covenant with Levi. Jesus is the "faithful descendant" who upholds it. [Hebrews 1:3](#)



1 - Jesus in the book of Malachi

6. Jesus as the Faithful Covenant Partner (*Malachi 2:10–16*)

Israel had "profaned the covenant" by marrying foreign women who worshipped idols and by dealing treacherously with their own wives.

This points to the need for a faithful Bridegroom. Jesus is the divine husband who is perfectly faithful to his bride (the church). [Ephesians 5:25-27](#)

7. Jesus as the Purifier (*Malachi 2:17*)

The people wearied God by suggesting that evil is good and asking, "Where is the God of justice?".

This impatience for justice looks forward to the ministry of Jesus. [2 Timothy 4:8](#)

8. Application: Preparing for the Second Coming

The message of [Malachi 2:15](#) to "take heed to your spirit" is a call to ensure their religion is not merely formalistic or superficial. Jesus is found in the call for his people to reflect his character in their personal lives, relationships, and stewardship, ensuring that iniquity is not found in their mouths. [Revelation 14:1-5](#)

9. The cleansing ministry of Jesus Christ

The Messenger of the Covenant

([Malachi 3:1](#)) - identifies the "Lord" who suddenly comes to His temple as Jesus Christ, the "Messenger of the Covenant." [Matthew 11:10](#)

The Divine Refiner ([Malachi 3:2-3](#)) -

Jesus is portrayed as a "refiner's fire" and "fuller's soap." [Hebrews 12:29](#)

The High Priest Purifying the Priesthood ([Malachi 3:3-4](#)) -

Christ's final work in the heavenly temple during the Investigative Judgment, cleansing His church from sin. [2 Corinthians 5:10](#)

10. The purification of His people before His 2nd coming

The Unchanging Surety (Malachi 3:6)

- The assurance that "I am the LORD, I do not change; therefore, you are not consumed" is seen as a promise of mercy through Jesus. Hebrews 4:16

The Savior in the Book of

Remembrance (Malachi 3:16-17) -

Jesus records the service of believers in the "book of remembrance," promising to spare them as "jewels" in the final day. Revelation 20:15

11. Jesus as the "Sun of Righteousness"

The Sun of Righteousness ([Malachi 4:2](#))

- The "Sun of Righteousness" is a direct representation of Jesus Christ. He rises with "healing in his wings," which is the restoration of sin-sick souls and the physical healing of the righteous at the resurrection. [1 Corinthians 15:42-44](#)

The Final Judge and Purifier ([Malachi 4:1, 3](#))

- The "day" that burns like an oven is interpreted as the final destruction of wickedness — a complete eradication of evil to make way for a new earth. [2 Peter 3:10](#)

12. Jesus brings final deliverance to the righteous

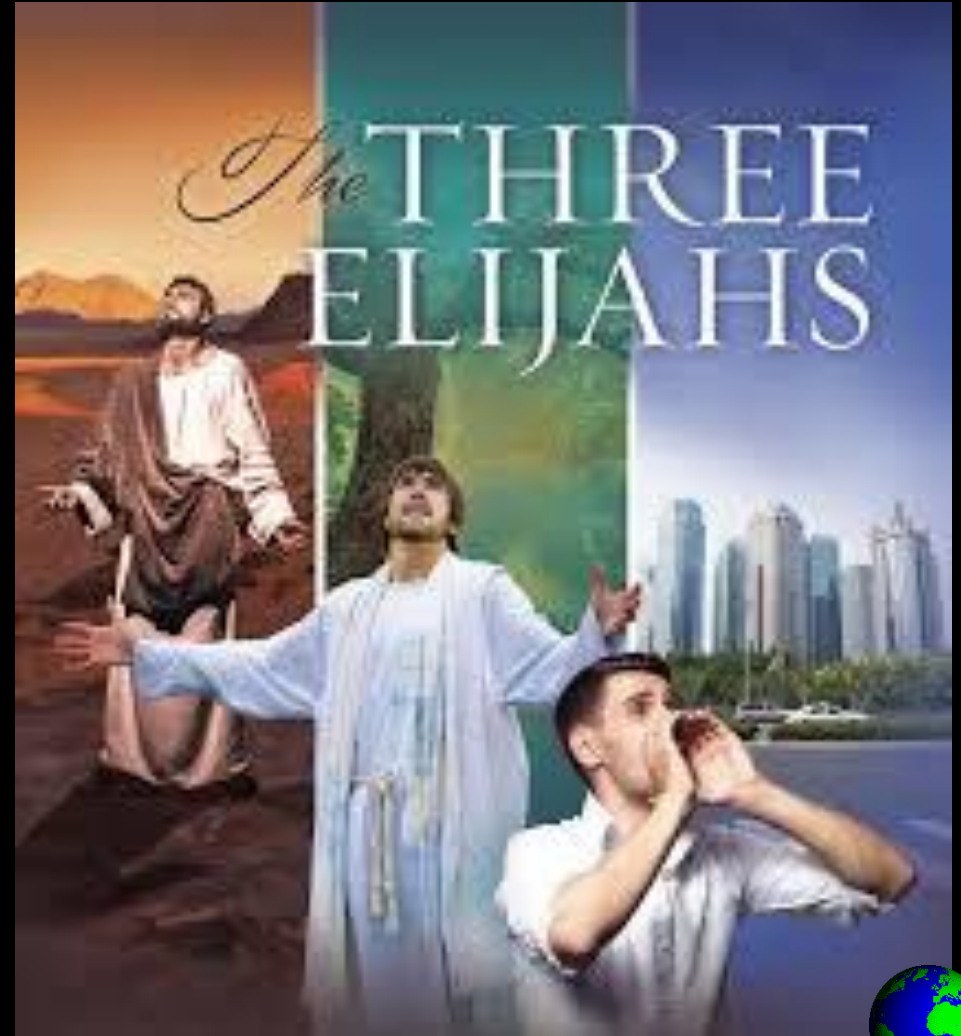
The Rebuilding of the Home (Malachi

4:5-6) – God sends Elijah to prepare the way for the Second Coming by restoring the hearts of parents and children to God and each other, preparing a people to receive Jesus. Luke 1:17 & Revelation 18:4

The Authority of the Word (Malachi 4:4) -

Jesus is found in this command by emphasizing the continuity of God's law, which is tied to the righteousness that Christ provides, guiding believers to live in alignment with His will before His return.

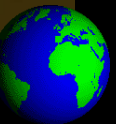


2 - Remnant in the book of Malachi

Chapter 1

God's Faithful "Few": [Malachi 1](#) addresses a corrupt priesthood and a largely unfaithful post-exilic community, but within this group, there was a "small remnant of those who were sincere in their faith in the LORD". [Romans 11:5](#).

The "Pure Offering" ([Malachi 1:11](#)): a prophecy expanding beyond the unfaithful Israel of that day to include a future global, spiritual people. [1 Peter 2:9](#).



2 - Remnant in the book of Malachi

Chapter 1

The Warning Against Formalism: The returned exiles, who brought "defiled food" (blemished sacrifices) to the table of the Lord. The remnant in this context are those who, unlike the majority, continue to honor God with genuine devotion rather than dry formalism. [2 Timothy 3:5](#)

Connection to Revelation 14: The message of Malachi is seen as a forerunner to the Three Angels' Messages, calling for a return to true worship and fear of God before the second coming of Christ. [Revelation 14:6-12](#)



2 - Remnant in the book of Malachi

Chapter 2

The Contrast with Corrupt Priesthood

(2:1–9): The majority of priests had turned away from truth and causing many to stumble. The remnant, therefore, are those who hold to the true "law of truth" and fear the name of the Lord. [Revelation 14:12](#)

Faithfulness in Marriage Covenant (2:10–

16): God hates divorce, as it is a breach of covenant, often done to marry pagan wives, which destroys the "godly offspring" (seed) intended to carry on the faith. The remnant maintains loyalty to God's standards of marriage and spiritual purity, rather than conforming to the surrounding culture. [Matthew 19:4-6](#)



2 - Remnant in the book of Malachi

Chapter 2

The Call to "Guard Yourself" (2:15-16): The remnant is actively involved in "taking heed to their spirit" —being vigilant and keeping their hearts pure and focused on God amidst widespread apostasy.

1 Timothy 4:1; 1 John 4:1

Preparation for the Final

Remnant: The behaviour described in [chapter 2](#) leads directly to the identification of the remnant in [3:16](#). - 1 Thessalonians 5:4-6

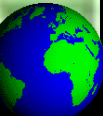

Chapter 3

A Distinct Group: The majority of the nation of Israel had become formalistic or corrupt (robbing God in tithes [Malachi 3:8-9](#)). The remnant "love the Lord," and return His blessings in tithes and offerings. [2 Corinthians 9:7](#)

The Book of Remembrance: God keeps a special record of those who remain faithful to Him in times of apostasy ([Malachi 3:16](#)). This is seen as a heavenly record of the "faithful few" (remnant) who have not compromised. [Revelation 3:5](#)



2 - Remnant in the book of Malachi

Chapter 3

The Refining Process: [Malachi 3:3-4](#) shows Christ purifying the "sons of Levi," enabling them to offer righteous offerings. This is the investigative judgment, where a purification occurs to distinguish true worshippers. This is the faithful remnant of [Revelation 12:17](#).

The Result of Faithfulness: God promises they will be His "special possession" (or "jewels") on the day He acts in judgment ([Malachi 3:17](#)). The remnant will overcome the Sunday Law crisis and receive the Seal of God. [Revelation 7:3](#)



When the observance of Sunday be mandatory, each person must decide whether to accept the sign of authority of God (Sabbath) or the authority of men (Sunday).



2 - Remnant in the book of Malachi

Chapter 4

The "Fear God" People (Malachi 4:2, 3:16-18): The remnant are defined as those who revere God's name amid a world that has rejected Him. They are the ones whose names are recorded in the "book of remembrance". Revelation 13:8

Final Destruction of the Wicked (v. 1): The remnant are spared from the fiery destruction that leaves the arrogant as "ashes under the soles of [their] feet". This as the literal, final destruction of the wicked, rather than eternal torment. 2 Thessalonians 1:9

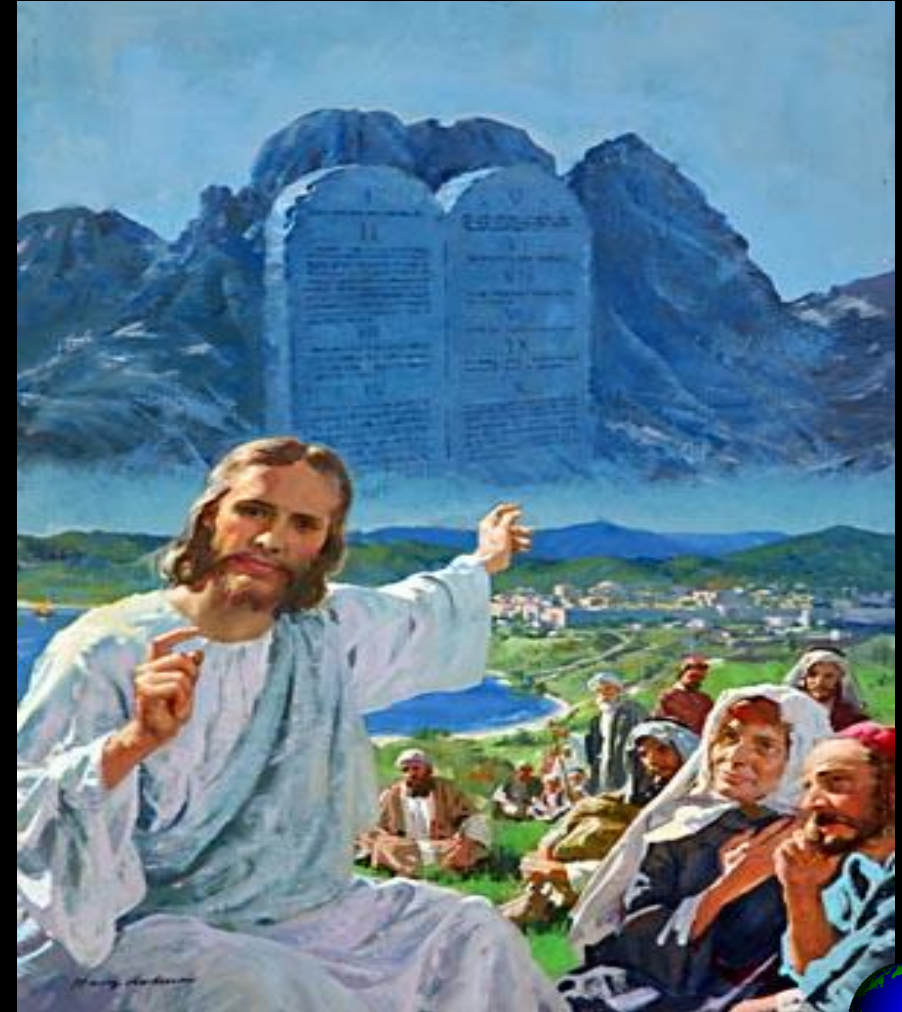


2 - Remnant in the book of Malachi

Chapter 4

Adherence to the Law (v. 4): The remnant is characterized by a call to "remember the commandments of God. This is the remnant in [Revelation 12:17](#)—those who "keep the commandments of God and have the testimony of Jesus Christ".

The Elijah Message (v. 5-6): The remnant is prepared by an end-time "Elijah" message that turns hearts back to God's law. This is the final movement which is the Three Angels' Messages of [Revelation 14](#)—that calls people out of false worship.



3 - Lessons in the book of Malachi

Heartfelt Worship vs. Formalism:

God rebukes the people and priests for offering blemished sacrifices (blind/lame animals), highlighting that God deserves our best, not just routine or cheap religious exercises.

The Importance of Tithes and Offerings:

[Malachi 3:8-10](#) is central, emphasizing that bringing the "whole tithe and offerings" is an acknowledgment of God's ownership of all things, leading to spiritual blessing rather than robbing God.

God's Unchanging Character and Love: Despite Israel's unfaithfulness, God declares He does not change in character ([Malachi 3:6](#)), proving His constant love and giving the remnant a chance to repent.

Marriage Covenant Faithfulness: The book confronts divorce and unfaithfulness, reminding husbands to be faithful to the "wife of their youth" ([Malachi 2:14-16](#)), as marriage is a covenant relationship before God.



3 - Lessons in the book of Malachi

Preparation for the Day of the Lord: Malachi warns that the day of the Lord will burn like a furnace for the wicked but bring healing for those who honor Him ([Malachi 4:1-2](#)).

The Elijah Message: The prophecy of Elijah turning hearts ([Malachi 4:5-6](#)) is interpreted as a vital end-time movement, calling for restoration, repentance, and reconciliation within families and the church before Jesus' return.

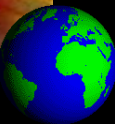

2 ⁸ Another Angel, a 2nd, followed, saying, “Fallen, Fallen is Babylon the Great, she who made all nations drink the wine of the passion of her sexual immorality.”

3 ⁹ & another Angel, a 3rd, followed them, saying with a loud voice, “If anyone worships the Beast & its Image & receives a Mark on his forehead or on his hand, ¹⁰ he also will drink the Wine of God’s Wrath, poured Full Strength into the Cup of his Anger & he will be tormented with fire & sulfur in the presence of the holy Angels & in the presence of the Lamb.”



Conclusion

Correction of Pride and Scepticism: The book confronts the complacency and cynicism of the post-exilic community who doubted God's justice or care, calling them back to covenant obedience. And Israel failed when the true lamb of God came in Jesus the Messiah resulting in the rejection of the nation of Israel and gospel goes to Gentiles.

Malachi serves as a call for spiritual revival, challenging believers to live faithfully and practically show the purity of the Gospel ([Matthew 24:14](#)) rather than engaging in mere profession.
