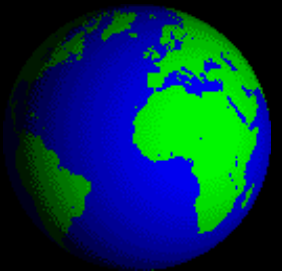

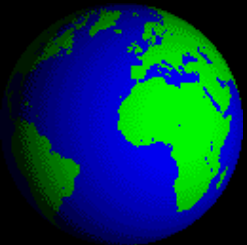

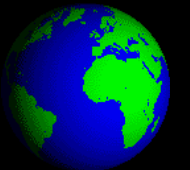

# Health Snippet – Blackberry

## Health Benefits of Blackberry (Seek Medical Advice)

Blackberry is a dark fruit that grows on prickly bushes of the genus *Rubus* (called brambles) and is part of the rose family. It's an "aggregate fruit" made up of a cluster of tiny, juicy individual fruits called drupelets.

Promote Heart Health: Has soluble fiber, which binds to cholesterol in the digestive tract and removes it from the body. Rich in anthocyanin improves cardiovascular health by reducing arterial plaque buildup and BP.

Aid Digestion: The soluble and insoluble fiber keeps waste moving through your gut to prevent constipation.

Stabilize Blood Sugar: low glycaemic index, causes slow, steady rise in blood sugar rather than a sharp spike.

Boost Brain Power: High polyphenols and anthocyanins combat oxidative stress and reduce inflammation in the brain, protects against memory loss & cognitive decline

Strengthen Bones & Immunity: high vitamin C (for immune function and collagen production), vitamin K (for blood clotting and bone strength), and manganese (for bone growth and metabolism).

**Side effects: too much can cause diarrhea or nausea.**

# Introduction

## *Luke 20–21: Journey to Jerusalem and the Call to Readiness*

**The Narrow Gate (Luke 13):** When asked if only a few will be saved, Jesus commands His followers to "strive" implying agony and intense, continuous effort to enter the narrow door.

**Divine Judgment and Grace:** Jesus tells the parable of the barren fig tree (Luke 13), highlighting God's patience and the urgent need for a fruitful spiritual life before probation closes.

**The Sabbath and True Worship:** Jesus heals the crippled woman on the Sabbath (Luke 13), emphasizing that the Sabbath is a day for releasing people from the bondage of Satan.

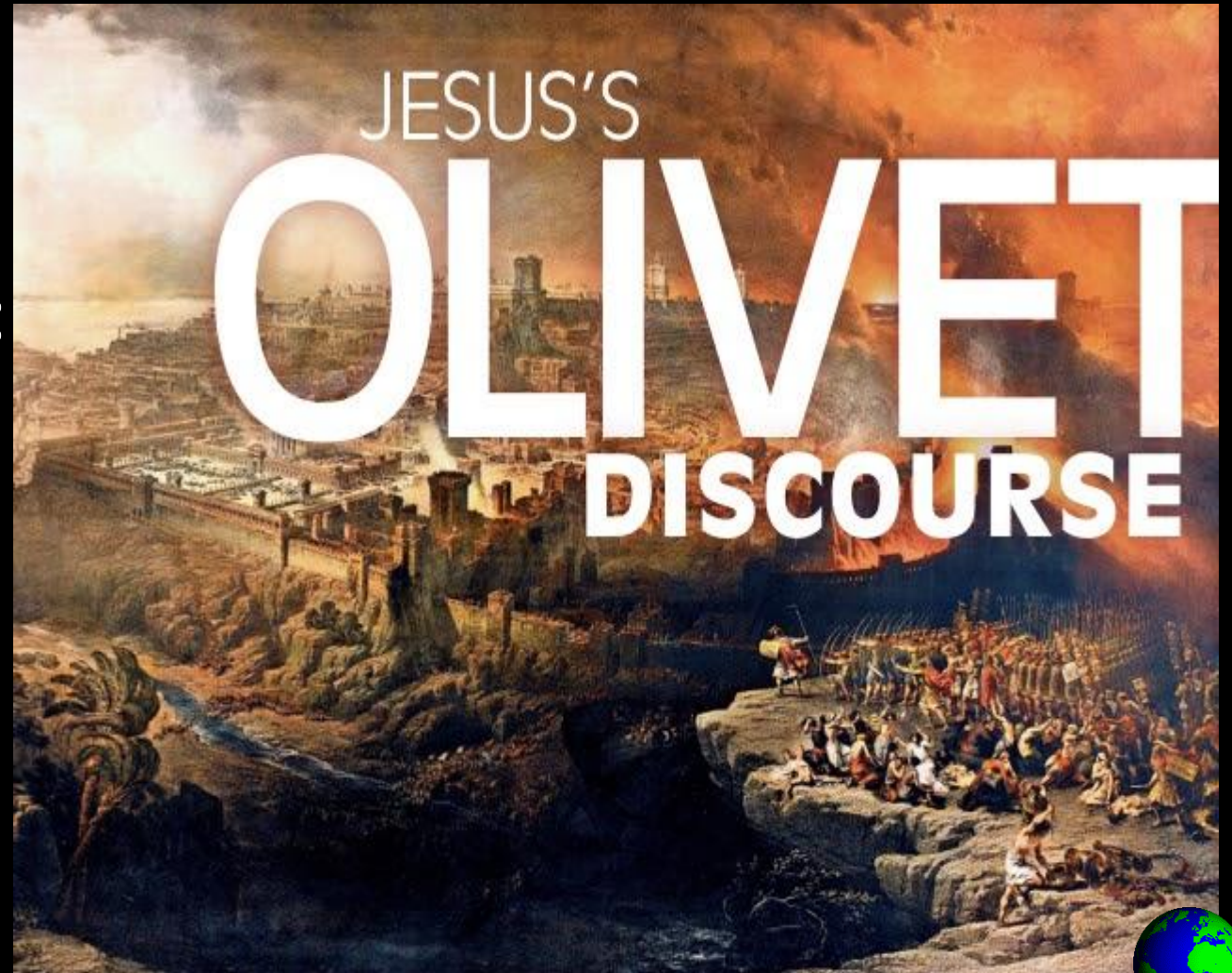
## *Luke 20–21: The Climax of Controversy and Signs of the End*

Rejection by Israel: Jesus exposes the hypocrisy of the religious system (Luke 20), which failed to recognize Him.

The Olivet Discourse (Luke 21):

Jesus foretells the destruction of Jerusalem and outlines the signs of His Second Coming.

The core theme here is watchful preparation, steadfastness, and standing firm before the "Son of man" during the perilous times preceding His return.



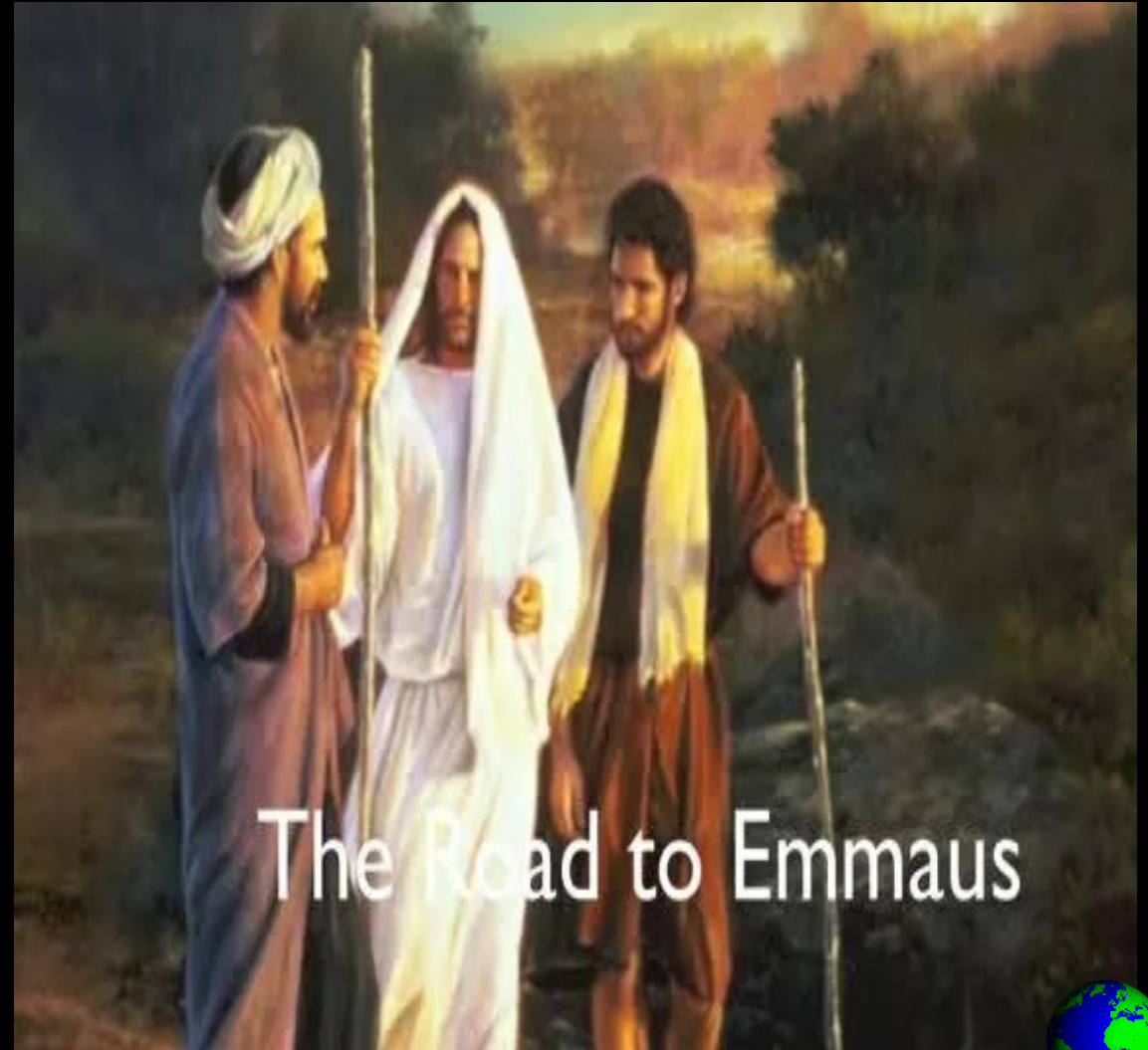
# Introduction

## *Luke 22–24: Sacrificial Atonement and Resurrection Victory*

The Last Supper (Luke 22): Instituting the communion service, Jesus points to the New Covenant and His broken body and shed blood.

The Investigative Judgment and Crucifixion: While Jesus hangs on the cross, the veil of the temple is symbolically prepared to be torn. The cross as the center of the plan of salvation, vindicating the character of God against the accusations of Satan.

The Resurrection and the Road to Emmaus (Luke 24): Jesus walks with two disciples on the road to Emmaus, opening the Scriptures to them.

# 3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

## Luke 13–16: Urgency and the Kingdom of God

### The Narrow Door & The Close of Probation (Luke 13:24):

Jesus warns listeners to "strive to enter in at the strait gate". Meaning to agonize or exert intense effort—not to earn salvation, but to vigorously resist sin and complacency.

The Parable of the Great Supper (Luke 14): Jesus exposes how worldly excuses keep people from the kingdom.



# 3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

## Luke 17–19: The Second Coming and Stewardship

As the Days of Noah were (Luke 17): Jesus describes the end of the world. He compares His return to the suddenness of the days of Noah and Lot. Life will seem normal until the sudden, literal, and visible return of Christ.

The Rich Young Ruler (Luke 18): Jesus challenges the young ruler to sell all he has. The lesson is that we cannot have one foot in the world and one foot in the kingdom. It is a call to total, uncompromised surrender.

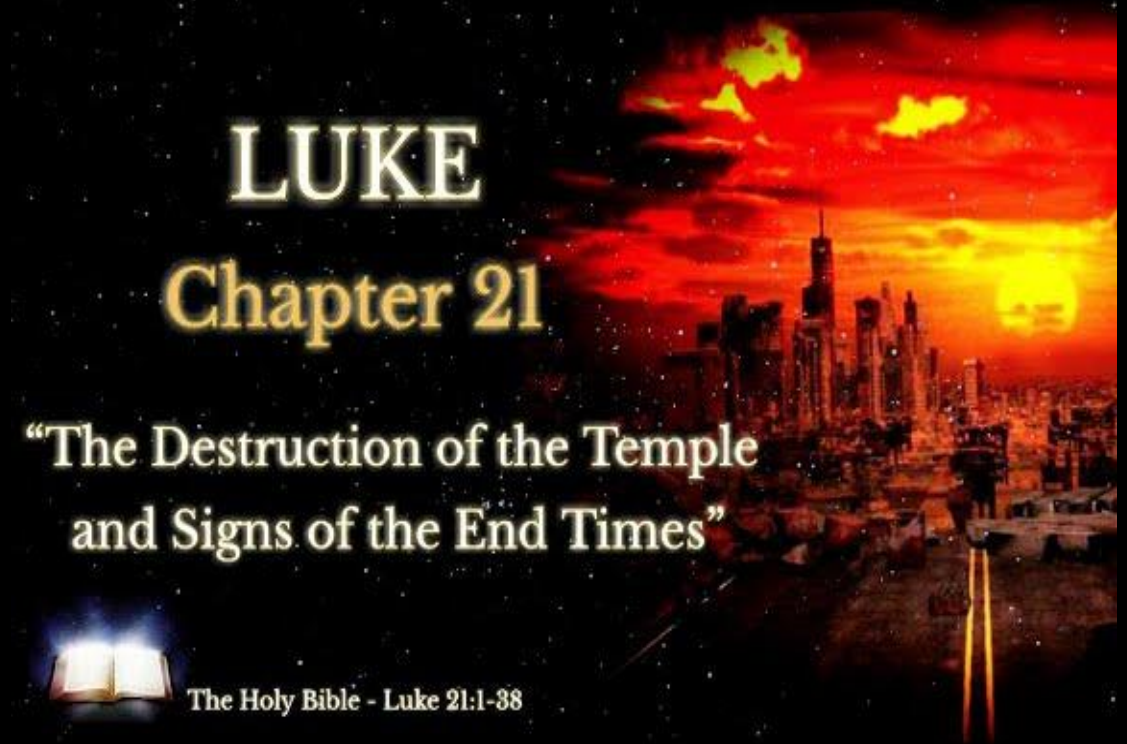


# **3 - Lessons in the book of Luke**

## **Luke 20–22: The Last Days and Betrayal**

**Signs of the End (Luke 21)**: Jesus prophesies the destruction of Jerusalem, which serves as a type (or miniature fulfillment) of the end of the world. He instructs His followers to "watch ye therefore, and pray always" (Luke 21:36) so they are spiritually prepared.

**The Last Supper (Luke 22)**: Jesus establishes the ordinances of communion and foot-washing, teaching servant leadership and humility.



# Conclusion

## *Luke 23–24: The Cross, Sabbath Rest, and Resurrection*

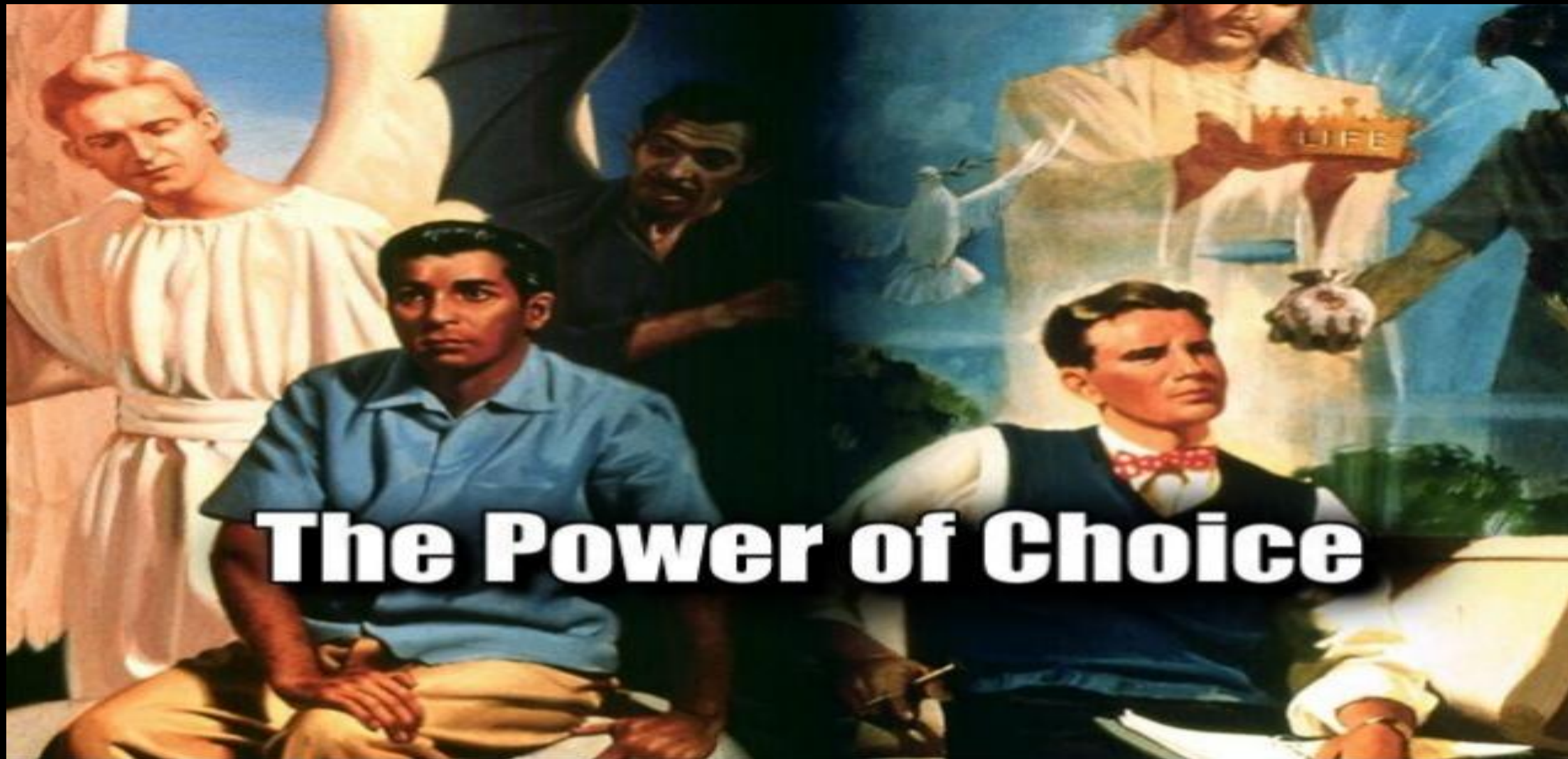
The Cross (Luke 23): Jesus' final sacrifice provides the ultimate atonement for sin. The "thief on the cross" demonstrates that salvation is by faith alone, apart from works.

The Sabbath Rest (Luke 23:56): Jesus rested in the tomb on the Sabbath day just as He rested on the seventh day of Creation, honouring the Sabbath as an eternal seal of God's authority.

The Road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35): Jesus walks with two grieving disciples on Sunday (the first day of the week), opening the Scriptures to them. It emphasizes that Jesus is always with His people during times of confusion and points to the authority of the Word of God.



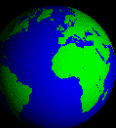
