Health Snippet – Breadfruit

Health Benefits of Breadfruit (Seek Medical Advice)

Breadfruit is a starchy, nutrient-rich tropical fruit related to jackfruit and mulberries. Referred to as a "tropical potato," because when cooked, its similar to freshly baked bread and it tastes much like a potato.

Digestive Health: Rich in dietary fiber, breadfruit promotes regular bowel movements, prevents constipation, and supports a healthy gut microbiome.

Blood Sugar Management: Compared to standard starches like wheat or rice, breadfruit has a lower glycaemic index (GI). Its complex carbohydrates break down slowly, which can help manage insulin resistance.

Heart Health: It is an excellent source of potassium and magnesium, which help regulate blood pressure and reduce cardiovascular stress.

Immune Support: It is a good source of vitamin C and contains beta-carotene, an antioxidant that the body converts to vitamin A to protect cells from damage.

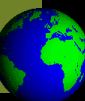
Complete Protein Profile: It has essential amino acids, providing a higher-quality protein source than potatoes

Side effects: digestive discomfort or allergic reactions.

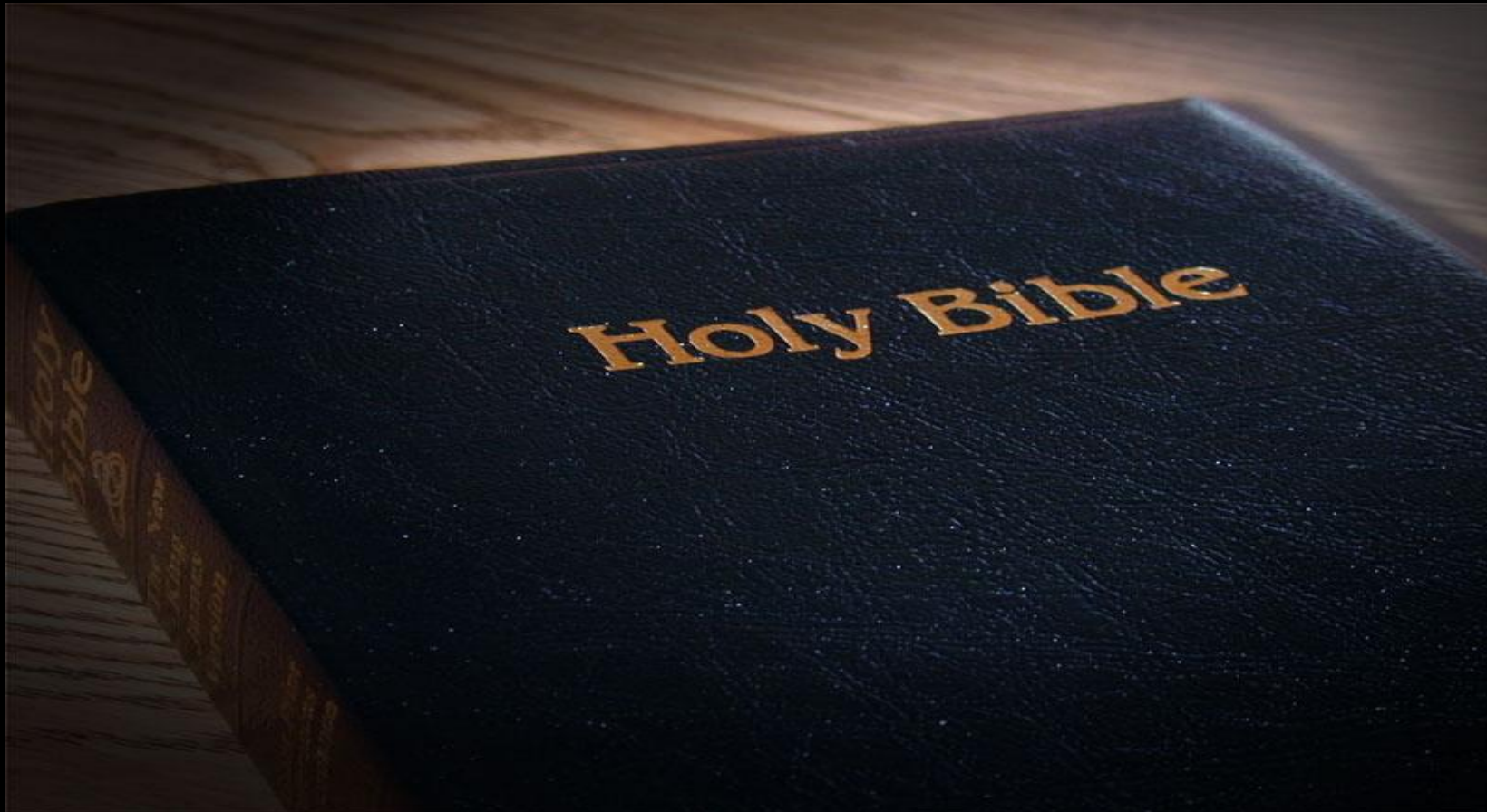

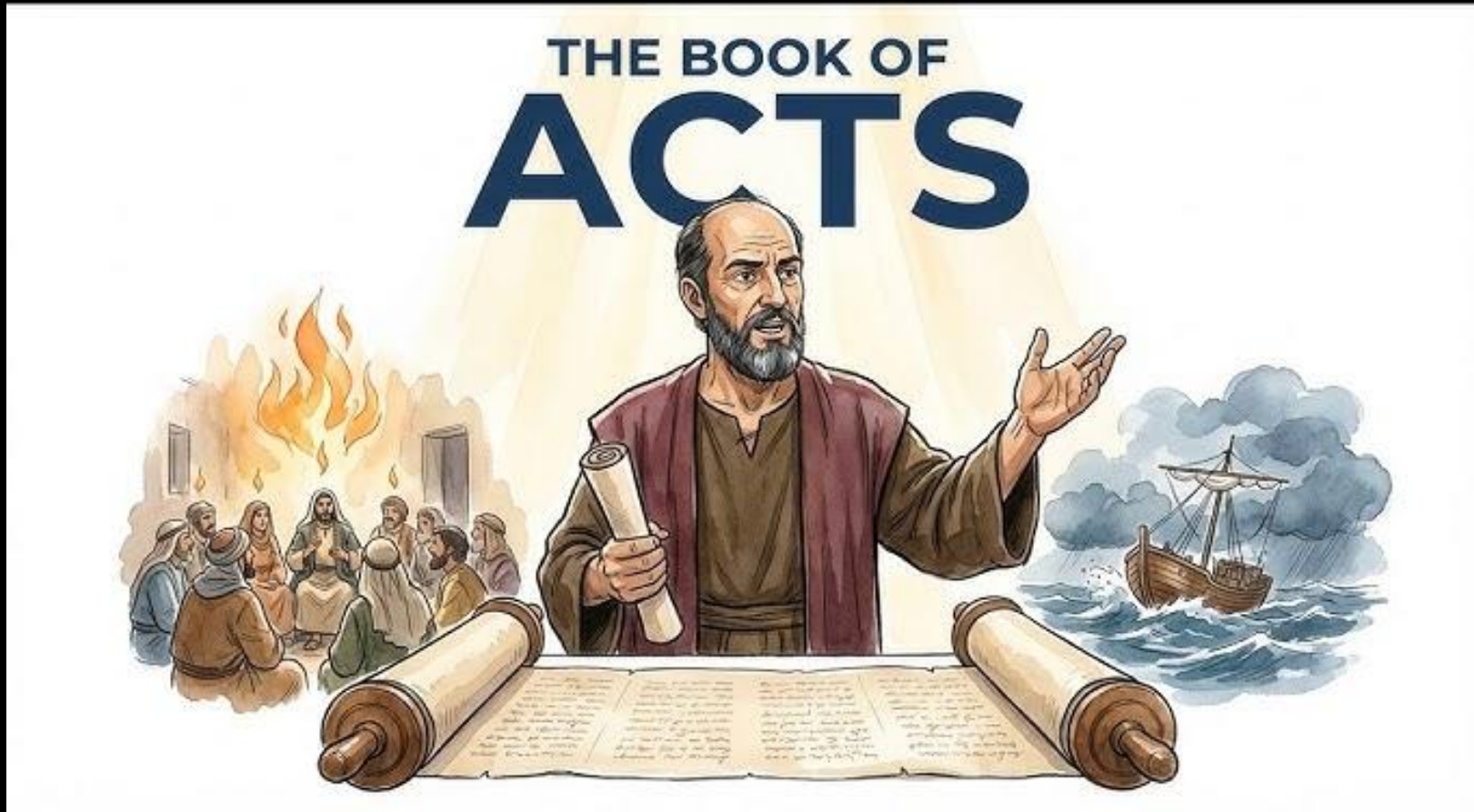

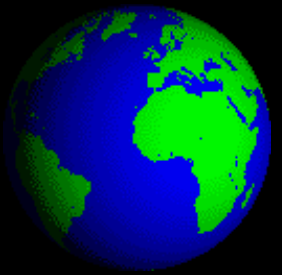

Introduction

1. The Power and Guidance of the Holy Spirit

This emphasizes that the church's mission cannot succeed through human strength alone.

Acts 1-14 chronicles the outpouring of the Spirit at Pentecost (**Acts 2**) and highlights the Spirit's role in equipping believers, leading church councils, and guiding apostles.

2. Unity and Devotion to Prayer

Before receiving the Holy Spirit, the disciples spent days in persistent, unified prayer ([Acts 1:14](#)).

These teachings emphasize that confessing sin and putting away differences were necessary preparations that enabled the outpouring of the Spirit.

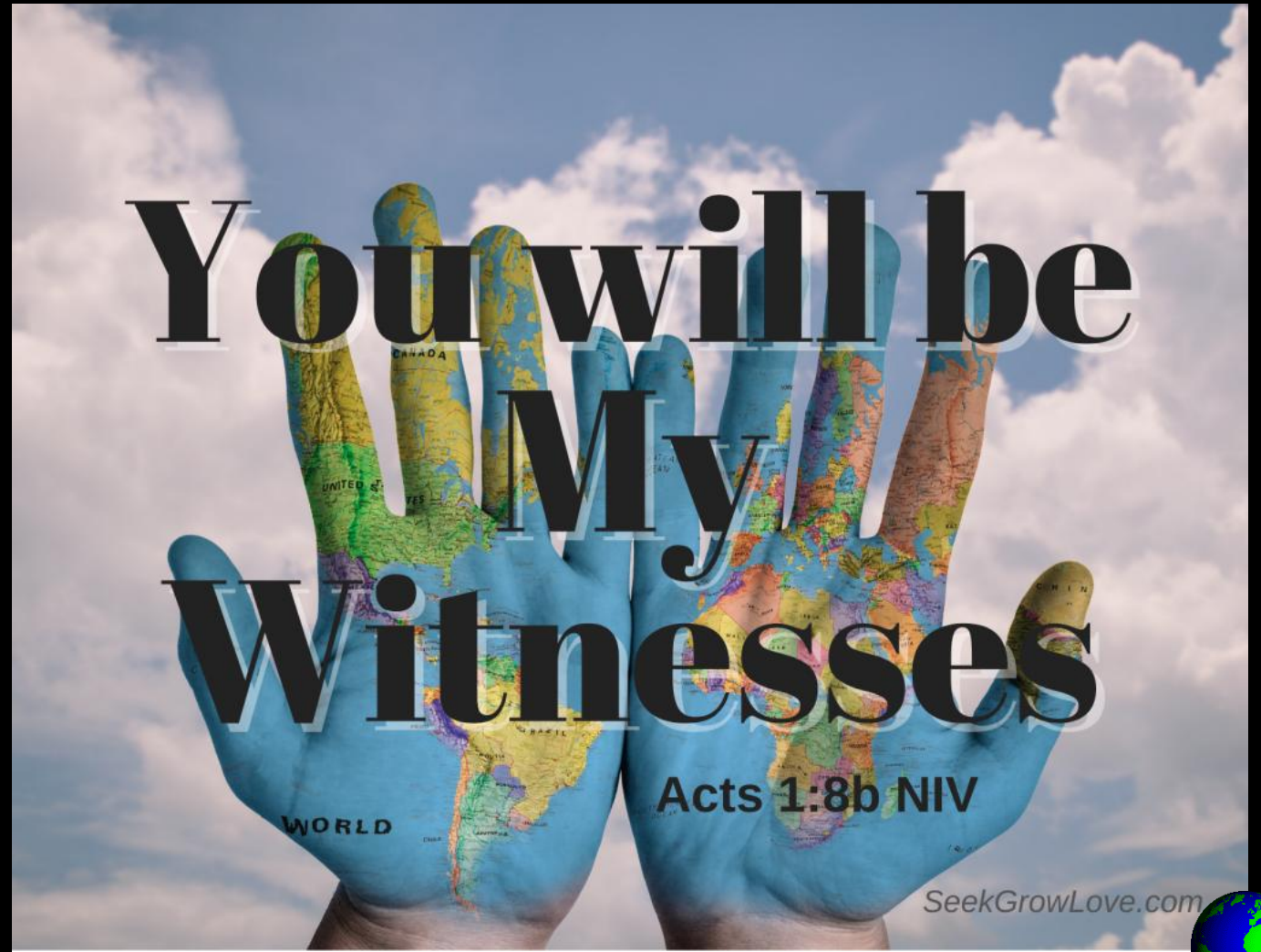
3. Fulfilling the "Acts 1:8" Blueprint

Acts 1:8 is considered the foundational theme of the entire book.

Jesus commands the disciples to be His witnesses in "Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Chapters 1-14

systematically record this geographical and cultural expansion: Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and Ends of the Earth.

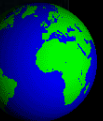


Introduction

4. The Transition from Rituals to Grace

This theology recognizes Acts as a shift from strict, ceremonial Jewish traditions to the universal grace of the gospel.

God's explicit revelation to Peter (the vision of unclean animals in [Acts 10](#)) was not just about dietary habits, but the theological declaration that salvation and church fellowship are open to all humanity.



Introduction

5. Bold Witness and Persecution

As the early church grew, it faced intense persecution from religious and political authorities. This highlights the courage of apostles like Peter and John, who obeyed God rather than man, demonstrating that true faith remains steadfast even amidst intense adversity.

3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

1. Total Dependence on the Holy Spirit:

Before launching the mission to the world, Jesus explicitly instructed His disciples to wait in Jerusalem for the "promise of the Father"—the outpouring of the Holy Spirit ([Acts 1:4-5](#)).

The ten days of deep heart-searching and putting away differences preceded Pentecost.

The remnant must seek this same "power from on high".



3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

2. Radical Unity and Purpose:

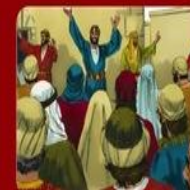
Acts 1:14 states that the early church "continued with one accord in prayer and supplication."

To effectively spread the gospel globally, the Remnant church must clear away grievances, be of "one mind", and focus entirely on the unified mission of presenting Christ's righteousness and His imminent return.

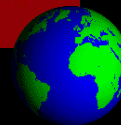

3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

3. The Centrality of the Threefold Message ([Acts 2-14](#)): In early Acts, the core of the apostolic preaching focused on Christ's resurrection, repentance, and the imminent restoration of all things (e.g., [Acts 3:19-21](#)). The remnant is called to be a visible, identifiable group that keeps "the commandments of God, and the faith of Jesus" proclaiming the 3 Angels Messages to all the world ([Revelation 14:12](#))



3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

4. Expansion from Jerusalem to the "Ends of the Earth": Acts 1:8 maps out the geographic progression of the gospel: "witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth."

The remnant must first nurture the church at home, then expand to surrounding communities, and eventually fund and send missionaries to the entire world before the end can come ([Matthew 24:14](#)).

Conclusion

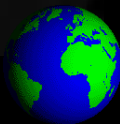
5. Remaining Steadfast Through Persecution: Chapters 4 - 14 detail intense pushback from religious and secular authorities (e.g., the stoning of Stephen in Acts 7).

The remnant is promised trials as it challenges the popular ideologies of Babylon. The early church's response to this persecution was to pray for boldness rather than comfort.

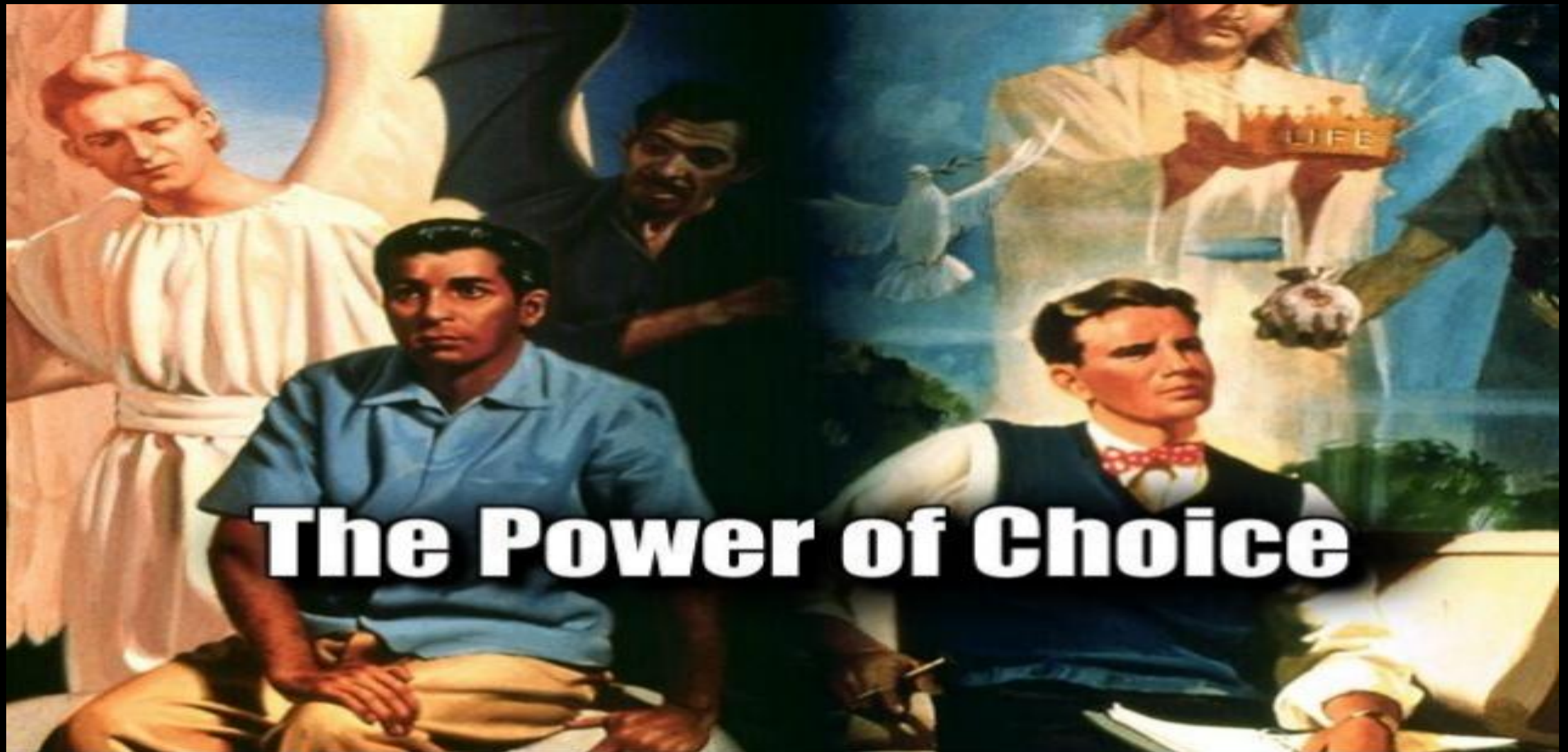
They modelled the "patience of the saints", standing firm on biblical truth regardless of the cost.
