


Health Snippet – Rest: Meditation

12. You worship God in His majestic glory (Deut. 4:39).







Christ's Ministry in the Heavenly Sanctuary

Throughout, Scripture presents the existence of a heavenly sanctuary or temple (Psalms 11:4; 102:19; Micah 1:2, 3). In vision, John the Revelator saw the heavenly sanctuary. He described it as "the temple of the tabernacle of the testimony in heaven" (Revelation 15:5) and "the temple of God. . . in heaven" (Revelation 11:19). There he saw the items that the furnishings of the holy place of the earthly sanctuary were modelled after, such as seven lampstands (Revelation 1:12) and an altar of incense (Rev. 8:3). And he saw there also the ark of the covenant which was like the one in the earthly Holy of Holies (Revelation 11:19).

The heavenly altar of incense is located before God's throne (Revelation 8:3; 9:13), which is in the heavenly temple of God (Revelation 4:2; 7:15; 16:17). Thus the heavenly throne room scene (Daniel 7:9, 10) is in the heavenly temple or sanctuary. This is why the final judgments issue from God's temple (Revelation 15:5-8).



The Ministry in the Heavenly Sanctuary

The message of the sanctuary was a message of salvation. God used its services to proclaim the gospel (Hebrews 4:2). The earthly sanctuary services were "a symbol [parabole in Greek—a parable] for the present time then present" —until Christ's first advent (Hebrews 9:9, 10). "Through symbol and ritual God purposed by means of this gospel-parable to focus the faith of Israel upon the sacrifice and priestly ministry of the world's Redeemer, the 'Lamb of God,' who would take away the sin of the world (Galatians 3:23; John 1:29)."

The sanctuary illustrated three phases of Christ's ministry:

- (1) The Substitutionary Sacrifice.**
- (2) The Priestly Mediation.**
- (3) The Final Judgment.**




1. *The Substitutionary Sacrifice*

Every sanctuary sacrifice symbolized Jesus' death for the forgiveness of sin, revealing the truth that "without shedding of blood there is no remission" (Hebrews 9:22). Those sacrifices illustrated the following truths:

1. God's judgment on sin: Because sin is a deep-seated rebellion against all that is good, pure, and true, it cannot be ignored. "The wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23).

2. Christ's substitutionary death: "All we like sheep have gone astray;. . . and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all" (Isaiah 53:6). "Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures"(1 Corinthians 15:3).

3. God provides the atoning sacrifice: That sacrifice is "Christ Jesus, whom God set forth to be a propitiation by His blood, through faith" (Romans 3:24, 25).



2. The Priestly Mediator

If the sacrifice atoned for sin, why was a priest necessary?

1. Mediator and atonement: The application of the atoning blood during the mediatorial ministry of the priest was also seen as a form of atonement (Leviticus 4:35).

2. The ministry in the holy place: The priestly ministry in the holy place of the sanctuary could be characterized as a ministry of intercession, forgiveness, reconciliation, and restoration. (Ephesians 2:18; Hebrews 4:14-16; 7:25; 9:24; 10:19-22).



3. The Final Judgment

The events on the Day of Atonement illustrate the three phases of God's final judgment.

They are:

- (1) The "Premillennial Judgment" (or "The Investigative Judgment") which is also called the "Pre-Advent Judgment";**
- (2) The "Millennial Judgment"; and**
- (3) The "Executive Judgment" which takes place at the end of the Millennium.**



A Time to Be Ready

God intends this good news of Christ's closing ministry of salvation to go to all the world before Christ's return. Central to this message is the everlasting gospel, which is to be proclaimed with a sense of urgency because "the hour of His [God's] judgment has come" (Revelation 14:7). This call warns the world that God's judgment is taking place now.

- And I went unto the angel, and said unto him, Give me the little book. And he said unto me, Take *it*, and eat it up; and it shall make thy belly bitter, but it shall be in thy mouth sweet as honey. — Revelation 10:9


Walking with Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

- **Genesis**: Introduces us to the creation of man Adam – Jesus Christ is the 2nd Adam.
- **Exodus**: Man drawn out of water, goes into the wilderness and returns to deliver his people. – Jesus comes out of the water in baptism, goes into the wilderness and goes to deliver His people.
- **Leviticus**: Work of the priest in cleansing the people from their sins – Jesus brings cleansing the people from their sins.
- **Numbers**: Moses leading the 12 and calling the 70 – Jesus also calls out 12 disciples and ordains 70.




Walking with Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

- **Deuteronomy:** Moses gives final sermon, calls the 12 tribes repeats the covenant, they sing a song, he goes out alone to die by himself. He dies, is buried and resurrected – Jesus gathers the 12 disciples at the end of His ministry, repeats the covenant, they sing a song, He goes alone to die by Himself. He dies, is buried and resurrected.
- **Joshua:** brings down a nation with a loud shout – Jesus before He dies, gives a loud shout “It is Finished”.
- **Judges:** The 12 tribes going forward to conquer even without a leader – the 12 disciples go forward to conquer even without their leader.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

- **Ruth**: a gentile woman with a Hebrew mother-in-law working in the field bringing in the sheaves –
- **Boaz is a type of Christ** – Boaz looking and attracted by the woman working in the field bringing in the sheaves – That's the kind of woman Jesus likes.
- **This woman says your God will be my God.**
- **1 Samuel**: Israel decided that they will reject their high priest (Samuel) to have a king to rule over them instead. This king will upsurge the authority of the priesthood. In effect this king brings together the Church and State. – After the followers of Jesus did their work in the field now reject their High Priest Jesus for a king named Constantine who decided to join church and state.




Walking with Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

- **2 Samuel to 2 Chronicles**: All of detail Israel's apostasy, which led them be taken captive by a kingdom named Babylon - This parallels the 1260 years which ends in 1798. So what comes next should be a major event after 1798.
- **Ezra**: there are 3 decrees to rebuild Jerusalem (look at parallels today).
- **1st Decree** is to bring attention to the Sanctuary (50,000 left to do this work) – **1st Angels message started to be preached 50,000 came.**



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

- **2nd Decree** was against the enemies of God's people – **2nd Angel's message is against Babylon.**
- **3rd Decree** was now to let the streets, walls and city be restored and Israel become their own autonomous power – **3rd Angel's message is just how the Seventh-day Adventist church was formed (21st May 1863)**
- **Nehemiah:** the **4th Decree** was to repair the breach: by now the Jews were discouraged in the work, they became caught up with making their own houses and doing their own things that they left the work of God fall by the way side. When Nehemiah hears this he goes to say, we need to get it together and finish the work – **Its been 170+ years since 1844, but now a 4th Angel must be sounded (loud cry) for the work to be finished.** (out pouring of the Holy Spirit – Revelation 18)
Need to repair the breach: Isaiah 58 – Sabbath.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

- The sad news is we have paused we are stuck between Ezra and Nehemiah today in the 21st century.
- We paused because we have got lives to live and fulfil our desires – time now to un-pause, need more Nehemiahs.
- **The call come out of Babylon: Why?** Unless people see the glory of Jesus in His woman (church=followers) why would one want to come out of Babylon.
- The out pouring of the Holy Spirit is a message and mission to see the glory of Christ crucified, buried and resurrected and soon return to take His faithful home. The message and the mission changes the character of His followers.

Walking with Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

- **Esther**: A death decree given against the people of God who refuse to keep the laws of the government – this does not happen until the 3 angels message is given out to all: Matthew 24:14.
- **Job**: A man (Job) goes through a time of trouble as if God has forsaken him – this is what will happen at the very end of time to God's faithful people.
- **Psalms**: David on his run from his enemy and David's cry Lord deliver me from my enemies – Exactly what will happen subsequently.




Walking with Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

- **Ecclesiastes & Proverbs**: full of words of wisdom and strange women: what is needed by Gods people in the last days to overcome the wine of the woman.
- **Song of Solomon**: the bride is described and the bridegroom coming for his bride – Jesus the bridegroom will come for His bride (second coming).
- **Major Prophets**: they all talk about the 2nd coming of Christ and the setting up of the millennial kingdom. They talk about the destruction of enemies of God's people.
- **Minor Prophets**: talk about the justice of God's judgement – during the millennium God's justice will be vindicated.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

- **Malachi**: the last book of the Old Testament ends with the wicked becoming ashes at the soles of the feet of the righteous.
- **The Gospels**: He will truly be with us.
- **Acts**: then there will be one language and all of God's people will be united.
- **Roman to Jude**: Jews and gentiles from every nation will come together.
- **Revelation**: we will see the unfolding of the revelation Jesus through all eternity.
- **This is the story of the Bible.**



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

Jesus is the symbol of His church: His church should follow Him, everywhere He goes.


Jesus was born: there was the birth of the new testament church.

Jesus was baptised: there was the baptism of the church at Pentecost (AD 31).

Jesus went into the wilderness: the early church would go into the wilderness for 1260 years (538 - 1798).

Jesus when He comes from the wilderness cleanses the temple: just after 1798 we see the cleansing of the sanctuary - beginning of judgement 1844.

Jews said took 46 years to build the temple (John 2:20) - $1798 + 46 = 1844$.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament


- Jesus turned water into wine at a wedding feast, they said kept the best for the last.
- Babylon is giving wine right now, God's people have the best wine for these last days.
- **It is time to un-pause now!**
- God needs you and me to be a Nehemiah to be the repairer of the breach.

Understanding Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament


- **Genesis to Judges:**
- Is the introduction of mankind, beginning with 1st Adam.
- **1 Corinthians 15:45** – And so it is written, The first man Adam was made a living soul; the last Adam *was made* a quickening spirit.
- **Christ is the 2nd Adam.**
- Just as there is an Old testament Adam, In the new testament we have a 2nd Adam – Jesus Christ.



Understanding Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

Exodus:

- **Main theme is the deliverance of God's people from captivity.**
- **Exodus 12:11** – the Lord's Passover: symbolic of Jesus Christ.
- **1 Corinthians 5:7** – Purge out therefore the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, as ye are unleavened. For even Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us:
- **Exodus 25:8** – And let them make me a sanctuary; that I may dwell among them.





Understanding Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

Can we see the shadow of Christ in Genesis & Exodus: we have Adam, Passover, Sanctuary & high priest. This parallels the work of Jesus the 2nd Adam who came into the world to be our Passover, and after the resurrection entered the heavenly sanctuary to be our heavenly high priest.

Hebrews 8:1-2 – Now of the things which we have spoken *this is* the sum: We have such an high priest, who is set on the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens; A minister of the sanctuary, and of the true tabernacle, which the Lord pitched, and not man.

This is the theme from Genesis all the way up to the book of Judges. This parallels the 70 weeks prophesy in the book of Daniel.



Understanding Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

1 Samuel to 2nd Chronicles:

1 Samuel 8:5-7 – And said unto him, Behold, thou art old, and thy sons walk not in thy ways: now make us a king to judge us like all the nations. But the thing displeased Samuel, when they said, Give us a king to judge us. And Samuel prayed unto the LORD. And the LORD said unto Samuel, Hearken unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto thee: for they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them.

The children of Israel have rejected the priest, because they want a king in his place. This then leads then into apostasy so much so that a power by name Babylon comes and destroys the temple or we can say defiles the temple, and carries them captive to Babylon. Now Babylon begins to rule.



Understanding Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

- Who did they decide they wanted as king? They wanted a man by the name Saul.
- **1 Samuel 9:2** – And he had a son, whose name *was* Saul, a choice young man, and a goodly: and *there was* not among the children of Israel a goodlier person than he: from his shoulders and upward *he was* higher than any of the people.
- **1 Samuel 10:1** - Then Samuel took a vial of oil, and poured *it* upon his head, and kissed him, and said, *Is it* not because the LORD hath anointed thee *to be* captain over his inheritance?



Understanding Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

Now the children of Israel reject the priest, chose a king who is beautiful and once anointed of God, but turned away from Him.

This ends with the story of the Sanctuary being burnt down by Babylon.

2 Chronicles 36:19-20 – And they burnt the house of God, and brake down the wall of Jerusalem, and burnt all the palaces thereof with fire, and destroyed all the goodly vessels thereof. And them that had escaped from the sword carried he away to Babylon; where they were servants to him and his sons until the reign of the kingdom of Persia:

There is an apostasy now, temple is destroyed and Babylon is ruling over Israel. This parallels the 1260 year prophesy in the book of Daniel.


Understanding Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

Ezra, Nehemiah & Esther:


Ezra 1:1-2 – Now in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, that the word of the LORD by the mouth of Jeremiah might be fulfilled, the LORD stirred up the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia, that he made a proclamation throughout all his kingdom, and *put it* also in writing, saying, Thus saith Cyrus king of Persia, The LORD God of heaven hath given me all the kingdoms of the earth; and he hath charged me to build him an house at Jerusalem, which *is* in Judah.

Now the children of Israel begin their journey back to Jerusalem to start the process of rebuilding or restoring the temple.

Both Ezra and Nehemiah are restoring the temple. This parallels the 2300 days prophesy of Daniel.



The 3 time prophecies of Daniel in the Old Testament



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Now we arrive at the book of Esther:

Esther 1:1-2 – Now it came to pass in the days of Ahasuerus, (this *is* Ahasuerus which reigned, from India even unto Ethiopia, *over* an hundred and seven and twenty provinces:) *That* in those days, when the king Ahasuerus sat on the throne of his kingdom, which *was* in Shushan the palace,

The book of Ezra begins with the king sitting on his throne in his kingdom.

Esther 1:3 – In the third year of his reign, he made a feast unto all his princes and his servants; the power of Persia and Media, the nobles and princes of the provinces, *being* before him:



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Daniel 7:9 – I beheld till the thrones were cast down, and the Ancient of days did sit, whose garment *was* white as snow, and the hair of his head like the pure wool: his throne *was like* the fiery flame, *and* his wheels *as* burning fire.

Now this is happening in the Medo-Persian empire. Not all Jews went to rebuild Jerusalem. God's people are under a secular society.

Esther 1:5-6 – And when these days were expired, the king made a feast unto all the people that were present in Shushan the palace, both unto great and small, seven days, in the court of the garden of the king's palace; *Where were* white, green, and blue, *hangings*, fastened with cords of fine linen and purple to silver rings and pillars of marble: the beds *were* of gold and silver, upon a pavement of red, and blue, and white, and black, marble.




Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Does any of this sounds like the sanctuary details? Yes they do!

- Please catch the allusions to the sanctuary.

Esther 3:2-3 – And all the king's servants, that *were* in the king's gate, bowed, and revered Haman: for the king had so commanded concerning him. But Mordecai bowed not, nor did *him* reverence. Then the king's servants, which *were* in the king's gate, said unto Mordecai, Why transgressest thou the king's commandment?

- Haman is exalted, but Mordecai does not bow to him.




Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Esther 3:4-5 – Now it came to pass, when they spake daily unto him, and he hearkened not unto them, that they told Haman, to see whether Mordecai's matters would stand: for he had told them that he *was* a Jew. And when Haman saw that Mordecai bowed not, nor did him reverence, then was Haman full of wrath.

- **Do you think Satan would like you to bow to him? Obviously Yes!**


He is walking up and down this world seeking to see who he can entice! If you say no to Satan, do you think you will get him full of wrath? Yes of course!



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Esther 3:6-9 – And he thought scorn to lay hands on Mordecai alone; for they had shewed him the people of Mordecai: wherefore Haman sought to destroy all the Jews that *were* throughout the whole kingdom of Ahasuerus, *even* the people of Mordecai. In the first month, that *is*, the month Nisan, in the twelfth year of king Ahasuerus, they cast Pur, that *is*, the lot, before Haman from day to day, and from month to month, *to* the twelfth *month*, that *is*, the month Adar. And Haman said unto king Ahasuerus, There is a certain people scattered abroad and dispersed among the people in all the provinces of thy kingdom; and their laws *are* diverse from all people; neither keep they the king's laws: therefore it *is* not for the king's profit to suffer them. If it please the king, let it be written that they may be destroyed: and I will pay ten thousand talents of silver to the hands of those that have the charge of the business, to bring *it* into the king's treasuries.

- **Haman by casting lots was choosing when the Jews should be destroyed.**



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

- **Revelation 12:17** – And the dragon was wroth with the woman, and went to make war with the remnant of her seed, which keep the commandments of God, and have the testimony of Jesus Christ.
- **Haman is a type of Satan himself, Satan is angry because we are not bowing, and keeping the commandments of God.**
- **We are studying in the context of where the book Esther is found in the Bible.**
- **Genesis to Judges** – Setting up of the sanctuary, and priesthood.
- **1 Samuel to 2 Chronicles** – We see apostasy, we see Babylon ruling and the temple defiled.
- **Ezra, Nehemiah & Esther** – Temple being rebuilt, Sanctuary being re-built.



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Haman is angry because they were keeping the commandments of God: Satan is angry.

Esther 3:13-14 – And the letters were sent by posts into all the king's provinces, to destroy, to kill, and to cause to perish, all Jews, both young and old, little children and women, in one day, *even* upon the thirteenth *day* of the twelfth month, which is the month Adar, and *to take* the spoil of them for a prey. The copy of the writing for a commandment to be given in every province was published unto all people, that they should be ready against that day.

- A universal decree to wipe out the people of God.



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Revelation 13:15 – And he had power to give life unto the image of the beast, that the image of the beast should both speak, and cause that as many as would not worship the image of the beast should be killed.

- **Mordechai send message to Esther.**

Esther 4:11 – All the king's servants, and the people of the king's provinces, do know, that whosoever, whether man or woman, shall come unto the king into the inner court, who is not called, *there is* one law of his to put *him* to death, except such to whom the king shall hold out the golden sceptre, that he may live: but I have not been called to come in unto the king these thirty days.



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

- Esther knows that no one can go to the king = most holy place unless at appointed time.

Esther 4:12-14 – And they told to Mordecai Esther's words. Then Mordecai commanded to answer Esther, Think not with thyself that thou shalt escape in the king's house, more than all the Jews. For if thou altogether holdest thy peace at this time, *then* shall there enlargement and deliverance arise to the Jews from another place; but thou and thy father's house shall be destroyed: and who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for *such* a time as this?



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Who knows that you have been brought upon the scene today for such a time as this as a chosen of God, and bride of Christ. To intercede, to plead, to witness to the people, who Satan is trying to destroy.

Esther 4:15-16 – Then Esther bade *them* return Mordecai *this answer*, Go, gather together all the Jews that are present in Shushan, and fast ye for me, and neither eat nor drink three days, night or day: I also and my maidens will fast likewise; and so will I go in unto the king, which *is* not according to the law: and if I perish, I perish.

The investigative judgement can sound scary. Can we even stand in the presence of the king?

But I am here to tell you today, that God has the best intentions for you in this investigative judgement. Do not be afraid. We have been brought to the kingdom for such a time as this.



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Esther 5:1 – Now it came to pass on the third day, that Esther put on *her royal apparel*, and stood in the inner court of the king's house, over against the king's house: and the king sat upon his royal throne in the royal house, over against the gate of the house.

- **You don't go to the king without the right apparel.**

In the judgement you are receiving favour from God. It might seem scary and feel like you deserve to die before the king because you are unworthy. But need to realise that implemented this investigative judgement because He is trying to do something for you.

- **He knows the enemy is coming to destroy you so he set it up so He will intervene for you.**




Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Esther 5:2-3 – And it was so, when the king saw Esther the queen standing in the court, *that* she obtained favour in his sight: and the king held out to Esther the golden sceptre that *was* in his hand. So Esther drew near, and touched the top of the sceptre. Then said the king unto her, What wilt thou, queen Esther? and what *is* thy request? it shall be even given thee to the half of the kingdom.

She asked for the king and Haman to a banquet the next day. Haman does not know that Esther knows what he is doing. And He does not know that Esther is Jewish. But look at this that same night....

Esther 5:14 – Then said Zeresh his wife and all his friends unto him, Let a gallows be made of fifty cubits high, and to morrow speak thou unto the king that Mordecai may be hanged thereon: then go thou in merrily with the king unto the banquet. And the thing pleased Haman; and he caused the gallows to be made.

- Haman is trying to get Mordecai hung. He hatched a plan to destroy Mordecai and the entire people of God.



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Esther 6:1 – On that night could not the king sleep, and he commanded to bring the book of records of the chronicles; and they were read before the king.

Esther 2:21-23 – In those days, while Mordecai sat in the king's gate, two of the king's chamberlains, Bigthan and Teresh, of those which kept the door, were wroth, and sought to lay hand on the king Ahasuerus. And the thing was known to Mordecai, who told *it* unto Esther the queen; and Esther certified the king *thereof* in Mordecai's name. And when inquisition was made of the matter, it was found out; therefore they were both hanged on a tree: and it was written in the book of the chronicles before the king.

- Mordecai's good deeds were written in the book. Mordecai recuses the life of the king.




Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

So that very night something is troubling him. We have a King who does not sleep and is interceding on our behalf. See Malachi 3:16-18.

Daniel 7:10 – A fiery stream issued and came forth from before him: thousand thousands ministered unto him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him: the judgment was set, and the books were opened.

- Why is God opening the books?
- He is opening the books, to highlight the good deeds of His people.



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

When you are living on behalf of God, He has your name written in the books because you are living according to His will to save lives. God will remember you.

John 10:10 – The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have *it* more abundantly.

- **Satan is trying to kill, what should we be doing?**

Luke 19:10 – For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost.

Mark 16:15-16 – And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.

Revelation 14:6 - And I saw another angel fly in the midst of heaven, having the everlasting gospel to preach unto them that dwell on the earth, and to every nation, and kindred, and tongue, and people,



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

- **Mordecai saved the king's life.**

In other words we save lives, living the gospel. Those who are walking with Christ, loving Christ have nothing to fear of the Judgement. God will vindicate our character. See Matthew 25:31-38.

Esther 6:3 – And the king said, What honour and dignity hath been done to Mordecai for this? Then said the king's servants that ministered unto him, There is nothing done for him.

God is wanting to bless us, He is trying to show us what will happen in the judgement.

Esther 6:4 – And the king said, Who *is* in the court? Now Haman was come into the outward court of the king's house, to speak unto the king to hang Mordecai on the gallows that he had prepared for him.



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Esther 6:5-8 –

5 And the king's servants said unto him, Behold, Haman standeth in the court. And the king said, Let him come in.

6 So Haman came in. And the king said unto him, What shall be done unto the man whom the king delighteth to honour? Now Haman thought in his heart, To whom would the king delight to do honour more than to myself?

7 And Haman answered the king, For the man whom the king delighteth to honour,

8 Let the royal apparel be brought which the king *useth* to wear, and the horse that the king rideth upon, and the crown royal which is set upon his head:



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Haman now has to bow at the feet of Mordecai. Do you know the bible says the wicked will bow at the feet of the righteous. – Proverbs 14:19.

- The judgement is about reversing Satan's decree on God's people.

Now Haman goes to the banquet and Esther exposes Haman's plot to kill Mordecai, her and all her people.

Esther 6:9-10 – And let this apparel and horse be delivered to the hand of one of the king's most noble princes, that they may array the man *withal* whom the king delighteth to honour, and bring him on horseback through the street of the city, and proclaim before him, Thus shall it be done to the man whom the king delighteth to honour. Then the king said to Haman, Make haste, *and* take the apparel and the horse, as thou hast said, and do even so to Mordecai the Jew, that sitteth at the king's gate: let nothing fail of all that thou hast spoken.




Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

- The very punishment that Haman wanted upon Mordecai, fell upon him.

Esther 8:3-5 – And Esther spake yet again before the king, and fell down at his feet, and besought him with tears to put away the mischief of Haman the Agagite, and his device that he had devised against the Jews. Then the king held out the golden sceptre toward Esther. So Esther arose, and stood before the king, And said, If it please the king, and if I have found favour in his sight, and the thing *seem* right before the king, and I *be* pleasing in his eyes, let it be written to reverse the letters devised by Haman the son of Hammedatha the Agagite, which he wrote to destroy the Jews which *are* in all the king's provinces:

- The judgement reverses the decree that condemns the people of God unjustly. The judgement is all about defending the people of God.
- If people are looking at the judgement as a scary thing. The question then is are you Haman?
- So, if you are not Haman, then you do not need to be afraid of the judgement.



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther


God is on your side in the judgement, He is trying to save you, He is not trying to get you lost, so set things right with Him.

Esther 9:5 – Thus the Jews smote all their enemies with the stroke of the sword, and slaughter, and destruction, and did what they would unto those that hated them.

The investigation of the books:

- 1. The Destruction of Haman.**
- 2. The Saving of the Righteous.**
- 3. The Destruction of the Wicked.**

This is what the judgement is about. It is the saving of God's people and destruction of the wicked.



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Esther 9:20-22 – And Mordecai wrote these things, and sent letters unto all the Jews that *were* in all the provinces of the king Ahasuerus, *both* nigh and far, To stablish *this* among them, that they should keep the fourteenth day of the month Adar, and the fifteenth day of the same, yearly, As the days wherein the Jews rested from their enemies, and the month which was turned unto them from sorrow to joy, and from mourning into a good day: that they should make them days of feasting and joy, and of sending portions one to another, and gifts to the poor.

- **Mordecai sets up a holiday to celebrate what God has done for them.**



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Where did this all happen?

- **Shushan:** is mentioned 21 times in the Bible (20 times in the book of Esther).

Daniel 8:1-2 – In the third year of the reign of king Belshazzar a vision appeared unto me, *even unto me Daniel*, after that which appeared unto me at the first. And I saw in a vision; and it came to pass, when I saw, that I *was* at Shushan *in* the palace, which *is* in the province of Elam; and I saw in a vision, and I was by the river of Ulai.

He sees a Ram and a He Goat. This is the very place we are introduced the 2300 days prophesy then shall the sanctuary be cleansed. Can you see the connection?



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Esther 9:24-25 – Because Haman the son of Hammedatha, the Agagite, the enemy of all the Jews, had devised against the Jews to destroy them, and had cast Pur, that *is*, the lot, to consume them, and to destroy them; But when *Esther* came before the king, he commanded by letters that his wicked device, which he devised against the Jews, should return upon his own head, and that he and his sons should be hanged on the gallows.

- **Where else in the Old testament the lots were cast? See Leviticus 16:8**



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Esther 9:26-27 – Wherefore they called these days Purim after the name of Pur. Therefore for all the words of this letter, and *of that* which they had seen concerning this matter, and which had come unto them, The Jews ordained, and took upon them, and upon their seed, and upon all such as joined themselves unto them, so as it should not fail, that they would keep these two days according to their writing, and according to their *appointed* time every year;

- **Yom-kippur or Yom-Hakippurim why?**

The Jews celebrate Purim just as they celebrate the day of atonement.

Leviticus 23:28 And ye shall do no work in that same day: for it *is* a day of atonement, to make an atonement for you before the LORD your God.



Understanding Remnant in the Bible – Esther

Leviticus 16:21-22 – And Aaron shall lay both his hands upon the head of the live goat, and confess over him all the iniquities of the children of Israel, and all their transgressions in all their sins, putting them upon the head of the goat, and shall send *him* away by the hand of a fit man into the wilderness: And the goat shall bear upon him all their iniquities unto a land not inhabited: and he shall let go the goat in the wilderness.

The very thing that Haman wanted to put upon Mordecai and upon the people of God. The very same thing was put upon his own head.

What God is showing us in the story of Esther?
God is showing us what He is doing for us to save us from the end time enemy who's wrath is seeking to destroy the people of God. Our king Jesus cannot sleep while He knows that there is someone out to destroy us.




Understanding Jesus in the Bible – Old Testament

The entire Old Testament is shadow form reveals the ministry of Jesus Christ, not only here on earth during the 70 weeks, but also in heaven for the 2300 days. It is showing us what our high priest is doing on our behalf to save us. **All revealed even before Jesus first coming.**

And if that is the case, we know that Jesus is coming again, let no one tell you that the 2300 days prophesy is not important. And the investigative judgement takes away one's salvation.

- **The king Jesus is saying someone is trying to touch my bride?**

He is not going to be a silent spectator.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

• What is sin?

Deuteronomy 5:22 - God wrote the law.

1 John 3:4 - Transgression of the law.

Romans 7:7 - Not know sin, but by law.

Romans 6:23 - Wages of sin is death.

• Prescription for sin in Old Testament:

- Leviticus 4:20 – Sacrifice of animal.
- Forgiveness of sin - Leviticus 4:26, 31, 35; 5:10,13, 16, 18; 6:7; 19:22
- Exodus 12:48-49 – Stranger need to be circumcised.



The Vaccine you must have – Jesus Blood


New Vaccine - DANIEL 9:24-27

24 Seventy weeks are determined upon thy people and upon thy holy city, to finish the transgression, and to make an end of sins, and to make reconciliation for iniquity, and to bring in everlasting righteousness, and to seal up the vision and prophecy, and to anoint the most Holy.

25 Know therefore and understand, *that* from the going forth of the commandment to restore and to build Jerusalem unto the Messiah the Prince *shall be* seven weeks, and threescore and two weeks: the street shall be built again, and the wall, even in troublous times.

26 And after threescore and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off, but not for himself: and the people of the prince that shall come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary; and the end thereof *shall be* with a flood, and unto the end of the war desolations are determined.

27 And he shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make *it* desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate.



The Vaccine you must have – Jesus Blood

New testament – unfolding the Vaccine

Phase 1 – The Outer Court

- Matthew, Mark, Luke & John points to the Outer Court Ministry.
- God himself came to earth, to shed His blood for us. - The production of the vaccine for sin.

John 1:29 – The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.

The arrival and production of the vaccine.

Jesus shed his blood for humanity –

This vaccine we need to take.

- The vaccine – The blood of Jesus Christ.
- The arrival and production of the vaccine.
- You may question other vaccine, but this is the vaccine you must have.

The Vaccine you must have – Jesus Blood

What does this vaccine accomplish:

- **John 1:7** – Cleanses us from all sin.
- **Revelation 12:11** – Overcome Satan
- **Colossians 2:10-11** – When we accept Christ He becomes our Circumcision.

In the OT one needs to be circumcised to be able to sacrifice in the Sanctuary.

In the NT we now have a Vaccine, the Blood of Jesus Christ.

The vaccine of Jesus Christ is going to do 2 things:

- **Deliver us from Sin**
- **Deliver us from Satan**

That is why you need to take this vaccine.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

Phase 2 – The Holy Place

From Acts to Revelation 11 is Holy place ministry.

Hebrews 9:11-12 – Christ high priest by His own blood brings redemption.

Now the administration of the vaccine by the High Priest Jesus Christ.

- Jesus enters into the Holy place –

Revelation 1:12 – Jesus in the midst of the 7 golden sticks.

- That is now the 7 churches – Revelation 2-3

Revelation 4:5 - Jesus is in the midst of 7 spirits of God.

- That is now the unfolding of the 7 seals – Revelation 4-8



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

Revelation 8:3 – Another angel (Jesus) with golden sensor next to the golden altar.

- Then you have the unfolding of the 7 trumpets in Revelation 8-11.

Acts 2:38 – Repent and be baptised, for the remission of sins.

- **Good news – The vaccine of Christ's blood puts you in remission of sins.**

Romans 3:25 – Jesus is propitiation of sins.

Hebrews 9:22 – Without shedding of blood, is no remission.

Hebrews 10:18 – Where remission is no more offering for sin.

Jesus offered His blood for us one time and that is enough for the remission of our sins.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

Ephesians 2:11-14 – Remember gentiles needed circumcision, but now in Jesus blood are made nigh. (See full text)

- The blood of Jesus removes the OT prescription for sin – No more ceremonial feast days, ceremonial sabbaths, ceremonial sacrifices etc...
- But the description for sin is still the same description for sin, nothings changed.
- Need to understand the plan of salvation and how it works, particularly the blood of Jesus.
- We are talking about the blood of Jesus as the vaccine for sin. The vaccine of Christ.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

Now what does this do for us?

When the vaccine of Christ puts us in remission, this is what it means –

Romans 8:1-4 – No condemnation who walk not after the flesh, but after the spirit.

The vaccine (Blood of Christ) removes the OT sacrifices.

The blood of Jesus enables to live victorious life and produces remission in us. We are forgiven by the blood and enabled to produce the righteousness of the Law.

Romans 8:5 – Walk not after the flesh, but after the spirit. The carnal mind does not like the description of sin. But when Christ comes in He enables to live in the spiritual mind.

Romans 8:7 - The spiritual mind in not in enmity with the law of God. Because the spiritual mind is the mind of Christ. The mind of Christ is always subject to the law of God. Means obeys the law of God just as he said I keep my father's commandments.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

So the vaccine (blood of Christ) allows us to be in remission.

It is very exciting. Remember when you are in remission, it does not mean that you are cured. The sin has not been blotted out.

Romans 7:22-25 – I delight in the law of God after the inward man, But....

We are in the flesh and the flesh desires sin. We can rejoice we are in remission, but not cured of sin yet.


If anyone says they are cured of sin, you make God a liar.

Because, there is a possibility that you can sin again. For example if a disease is in remission you cannot be sure it wont get worse again. But when it is cured it is done. It is finished.

Right now we are in remission, held in check so to speak. Just look at the world around us, you can see that sin is not eradicated.

1 Timothy 6:12 - Fight the good fight of faith. Why are we fighting if everything is done at the cross and the battle is done.

Once you accept Christ, you are in remission of sin, not completely cured from it.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

1 John 1:9 – This text is there because sin is not done away yet. So that if at all we sin we can confess and be forgiven and be in remission of sins.

Praise God that he does not say you sin once, I am done with you. Jesus says: just hold on and it is going to be over soon when I come I'm going to solve this problem.


Some do not believe in this Vaccine and so they do not take it. Do you believe in the vaccine (Jesus), they say no, not real, not interested in the Vaccine (Jesus).

Some actually go for the famous company Satan's company selling the counterfeit vaccine (anti-Christ).

What the false Vaccine (false Gospel) sellers, say you can do what ever you want and even if you sin you still go to heaven.

Don't worry about the law of God, the vaccine (Jesus Blood) gets rid of the law of God.

Once you got the Vaccine (blood) good to go. Once saved always saved.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

Phase 3 – The Most Holy Place

This 3rd phase introduces us in Revelation 11:18-19 – The temple opened and Ark of his testament seen.

The first time that in the book of Revelation we are introduced to the Most Holy Place. Infact in the entire New testament first time we are being introduced to the view in the context of events in the most holy place.

Revelation 11 – 22: revolves around the most holy place.

It is Christ's most holy place ministry.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament


Recap of the entire New testament:

Phase 1 – Matthew, Mark, Luke & John is the production of the vaccine for the cure of sins.

Phase 2 – Acts to Revelation 11 is the administration of the vaccine for the remission of sins.

Phase 3 – Revelation 11-22 is the final blotting out of sins. The final consummation or the final restitution of all things.

- This is the 3rd phase of the application of the vaccine.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

Acts 2:38 – be baptised for remission of sins and receive the Holy ghost.

Phase 2 is the remission of sins and you receive the Holy Ghost.

Acts 3:19-21 – repent and be converted that your sins may be blotted out. (40 prophets)

The remission of sins is connected with the coming of the holy spirit.


The blotting out of sins is connected with the 2nd coming of Jesus.

What does the time of restitution of all things mean?

Matthew 12:13 – restored is the word.

- **Restored to what? Restored to its original condition.**
- **What was the original condition of earth and man?**
- **It was a world without sin!**

So the bible is telling us that all things will be restored to the way they were before sin entered the world.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

The 3rd phase which is the vaccine is the ministrations of Jesus to blot out our remission of sin and to restore.

Daniel 8:13-14 – Cleansing of the temple.

1 Corinthians 6:19 – your body is temple.

We are the temples, so God is telling us we will be cured, restored, put back into the original condition before sin entered.


This is the entire purpose of the Day of Atonement, which is the blotting out of Sin.

There are 3 phases to the vaccine of Christ –

1st is the production.

2nd is the Remission.

3rd is the blotting out.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

What will be restored?

1. Some do not want to take the vaccine!
2. Some just want the vaccine and say I don't need to keep the law of God, just good to go anyway. That is a counterfeit vaccine: snake oil – a counterfeit blood.

Because the blood of Jesus brings remission to sin and the law points what is sin. So if I fall I can ask for forgiveness. If no law simply means no sin. A time is soon coming when Jesus is going to remove all sin completely.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament


Revelation 3:5 – He that overcometh, the same shall be clothed in white raiment; and I will not blot out his name out of the book of life, but I will confess his name before my Father, and before his angels.

Is a warning for those who refuse the cure or have a false cure. Those who refuse the cure their names will be blotted out from the book of life. **So we can either have our sins blotted out or our names blotted out, choice is ours. Which one do you want blotted out?**



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

- **I want my sins blotted out, not my name blotted out.**
- The restoration of all things means, God is going to consume and restore all things. Which means He will consume sin and sinners.
- **Daniel 2:44** – God's sets up a kingdom strong as iron, which will never fall.
- **Daniel 7:25-26** – But judgement is set, to consume and destroy man of sin.
- **2 Thessalonians 2:8** – Wicked destroyed with the brightness of Jesus 2nd coming.
- **Isaiah 1:28** – destruction of all forsakers of God, transgressors & sinners together.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

- In the investigative judgement, in the final blotting out not only sin will be blotted out, also sinners will be blotted out.
- **These are those who were not cured because they took a counterfeit vaccine.**
- This why God has called His people to preach the everlasting gospel of Revelation 14:6-12. Because what is going out now is the wine, the wine of Babylon.
- **The wine symbolises the blood of Jesus. There are people out there selling counterfeit wine.**
- **When you drink strong wine you forget the Law of God. But the blood of Jesus will enable one to keep His Law the 10 Commandments.**



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

- **Not only sin will be consumed, sinners and Satan himself will also be consumed.**
- Daniel 9:26-27 – Messiah, the covenant, the sacrifice, the blood (vaccine).
- **We are talking about the 7 last plagues here. We are talking about the end of the war. We are talking about the consummation of all things.**
- **Zephaniah 1:18** - (Speedy riddance is the same word used for consummation in Daniel 9:24).
- **So the consummation is when God makes an end of sin and sinners.**



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

- God is teaching us in the entire new testament how the vaccination process works.
 1. **1st it is produced** – Matthew, Mark, Luke & John: the 70 weeks prophecy.
 2. **2nd it is administered for the remission of sins** – Acts to Revelation 11: which covers the span of the 1260 years prophecy.
 3. **3rd it is the curing of from sin** – Revelation 11 – 22: which is the blotting out of sin and of sinners including Satan.
- Satan does not want the world to understand this, because he wants them to be content with counterfeit blood (vaccine).



The promises of Old and New Covenants

We need to remember that a covenant is a promise. The old covenant was based on the promises of men and women who hoped to gain salvation by their own effort of obedience and animal blood. The new covenant, or everlasting covenant, on the other hand, is the blood of Jesus a one-sided promise by God to write His Law in the hearts of His people (See [Hebrews 8:10-12](#); [Jeremiah 31:31-34](#)). The people need only to accept God's promise by faith in order for the covenant to become active in their lives. It is a promise of righteousness which translates into everlasting life.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

A Counterfeit blood (vaccine) that says:

1. The Sabbath is done away with.
2. Don't have to keep the Law of God.
3. There is no description of sin anymore. All you have to do is do what is right and not do what you think is not right.


That is counterfeit wine – the wine of Babylon.

Nahum 1:8 – But with an overrunning flood he will make an utter end of the place thereof, and darkness shall pursue his enemies.

God is going to make an utter end of sin and we don't need to guess that, because ...

Nahum 1:9 – What do ye imagine against the LORD? he will make an utter end: affliction shall not rise up the second time.

- Sin is blotted out completely forever.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

Revelation 14:3-5 Describe the redeemed of God, notice how their sins have been blotted out. They have been cleansed, purified and cured of sin.

Let's back this up:

Isaiah 44:21-22 – I have formed thee; thou *art* my servant: O Israel, thou shalt not be forgotten of me.

This is not in the past, look at the next verse:

Isaiah 44:23 – Sing, for the LORD hath redeemed Jacob, and glorified himself in Israel.

Why do you think the 144,000 are singing?

Because their sins have been blotted out at that time. That is why they are singing on mount Zion, because God has redeemed them from the earth.

Revelation 12:11 - And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

Let us re-cap: There are 3 phases of the vaccine –

Phase 1 - The production of the vaccine – Matthew, Mark, Luke & John.

Phase 2 – Acts to Revelation 11: Our heavenly high priest is administering the vaccine to all who will come to him in faith. That is His holy place phase of ministry. In this phase of ministry we receive the remission of sins. In which we can have assurance and we can know that we are connected with God and we can rest in peace that we are not in the condition that we were before. Because we are in remission. This is not being cured of sin. Sin still exists. It is still dwelling in us, so even though in our minds we do not want to sin. Our sinful flesh is still with war with the mind. Which simply makes us realise we are in remission and not cured of sin.

Final phase Revelation 11-22: Is the blotting out or the consummation or the restitution of all things to the way before sin entered the world. This is what the blotting out of sins is. The final phase of Christ's ministry in the most holy place.



Walking with Jesus in the Bible – New Testament

This why God has given a special message to His chosen people to take into the world to say – you are on the wrong blood the counterfeit blood. The vaccine that you have been using is telling you that the Law of God doesn't have to be kept. It's the one tell you that once you are saved you are always saved. The one that tells you the Sabbath which is part of the Law of God is done away with.

No, No, No, the blood of Jesus enables you to keep the 10 commandments, it does not get rid of the 10 commandments. The blood of Jesus removes the old prescription for sin (the sacrificial system of Old Testament) because it now the new prescription for sin.

Because everyone will be vaccinated, and will be vaccinated by either the pure blood of Jesus or the counterfeit blood the wine of Babylon.

If you are not vaccinated by the true blood of lamb (Jesus), you will get the mark of the beast.

God is showing us how we need to work according to the vaccine of Jesus.

Jesus is coming soon to blot out all sins and restore all things to the way they were before.

If we are not part of that process, when Jesus comes he find sin in us and on us and we will have no opportunity or chance, because he is coming to destroy all that is called sin.


This is the plan of salvation that God has for man.



When the observance of Sunday be mandatory, each person must decide whether to accept the sign of authority of God (Sabbath) or the authority of men (Sunday).


